

Ash Wednesday Mass Celebration

To begin the Lenten season of our Catholic Church in the school, the Ash Wednesday mass was held on 6th March 2019 in the school chapel. Before the mass, the meaning of Lent was introduced. Students and teachers were reminded that Lent is a time to pray, to ask forgiveness, to repent, to “die”, to renew, to fast, to give alms, to love and to imitate Jesus Christ.
