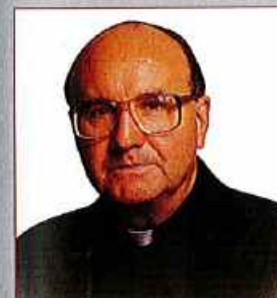

## Making the Cake (PTA) the 45th Anniversary

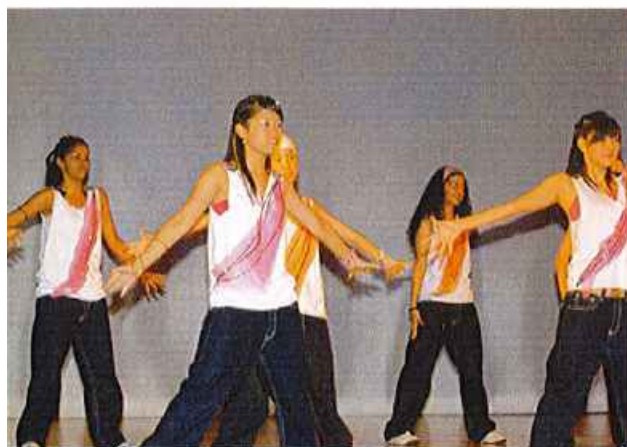

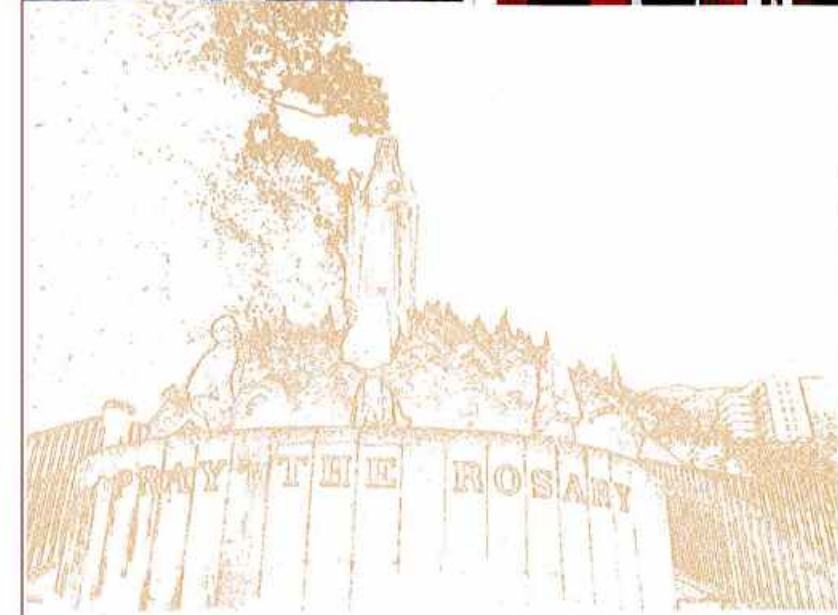
## RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES

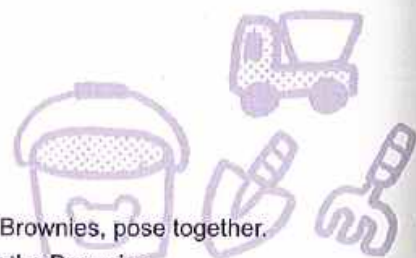


## CUBS / BROWNIES / RED CROSS

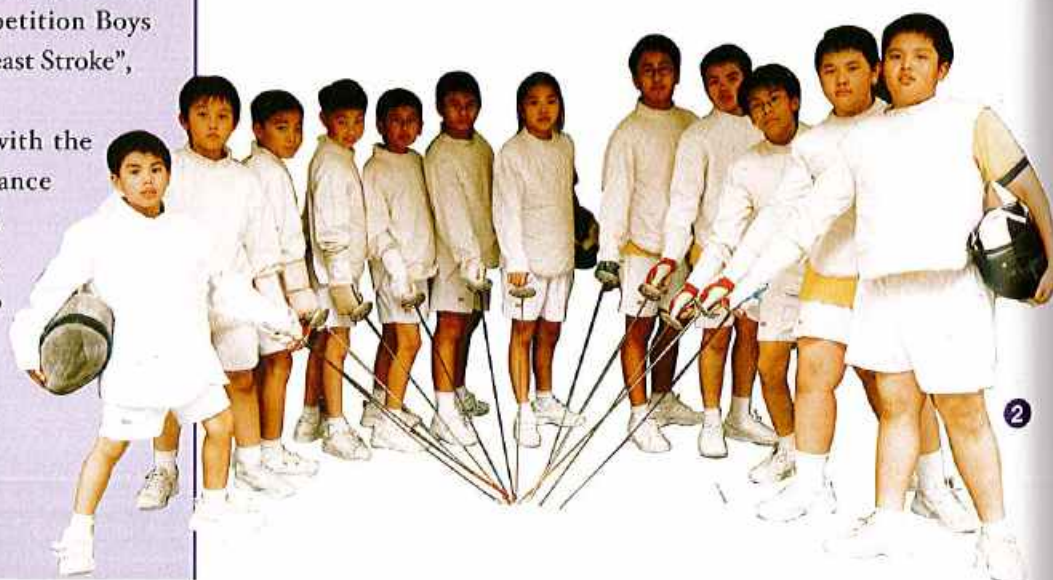


## SPORTS TEAMS

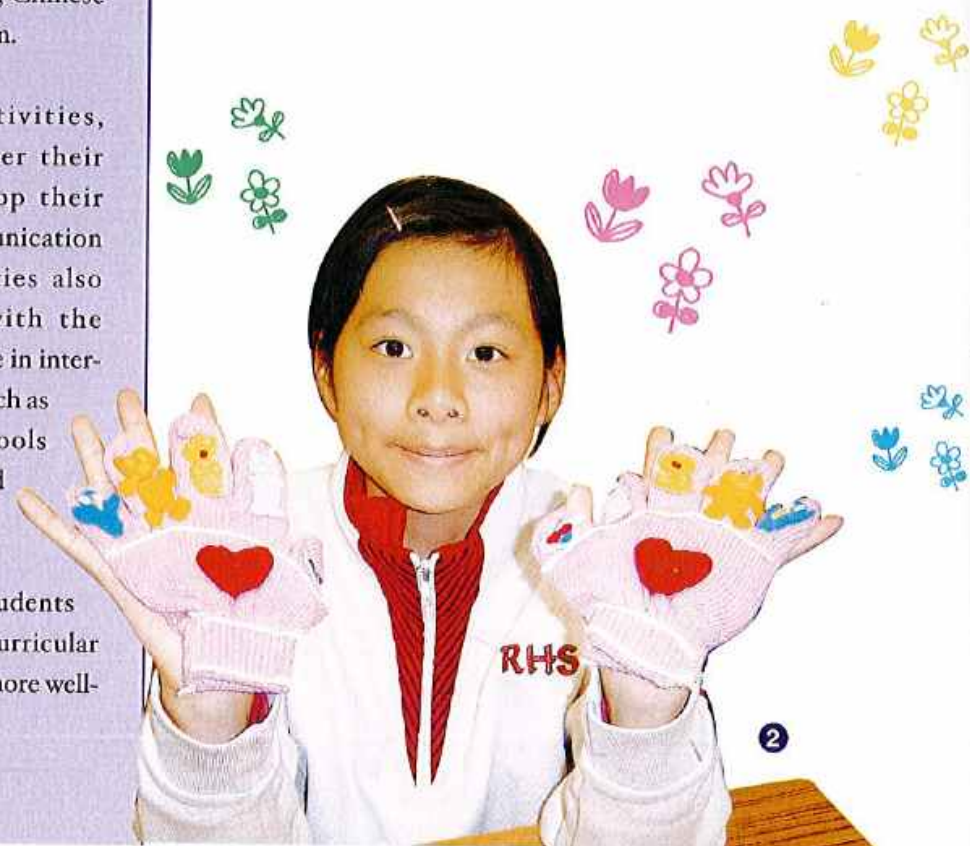


# EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

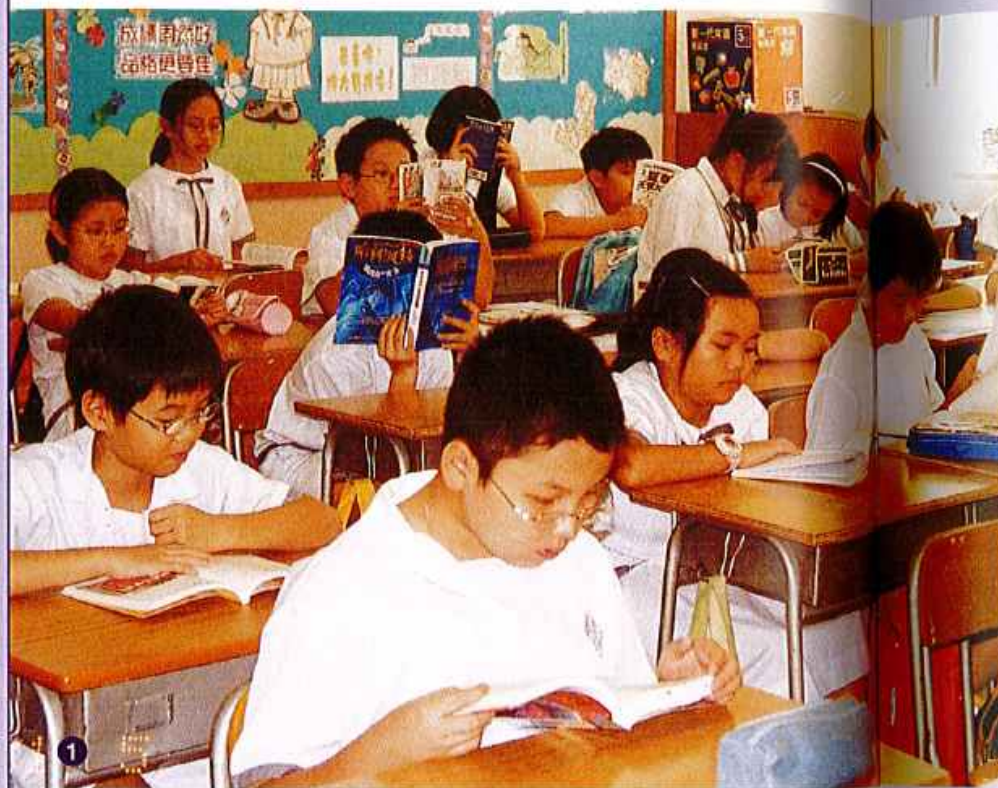


## AFTER LUNCH ACTIVITIES

# THE JOY OF READING

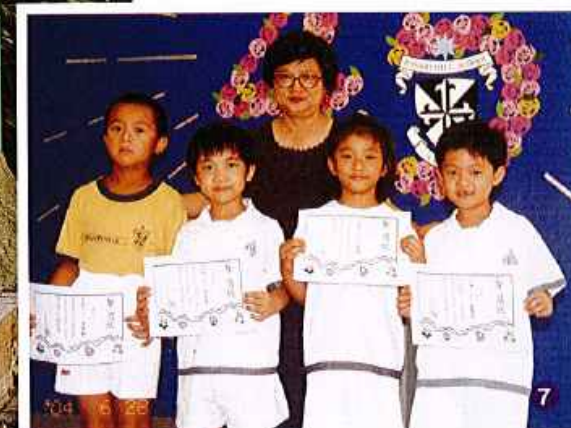

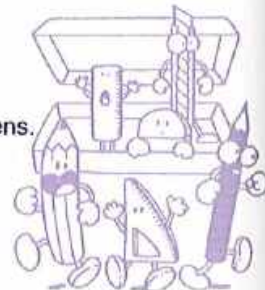


# THE KNIGHTS OF MATHEMATICS KINGDOM

# GENERAL STUDIES ACTIVITIES

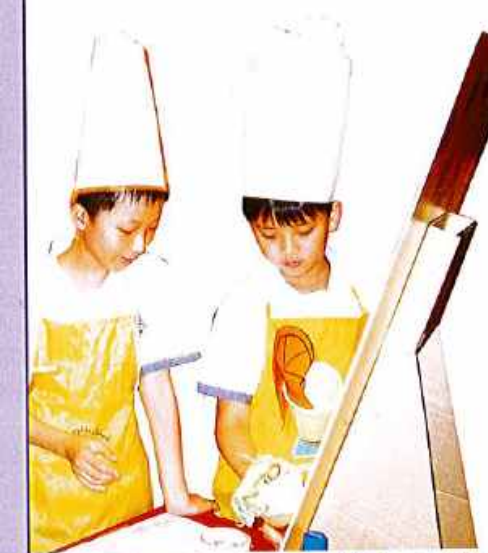

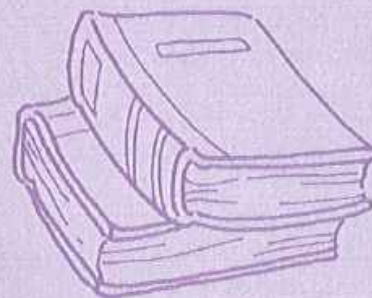

## 中文科活動

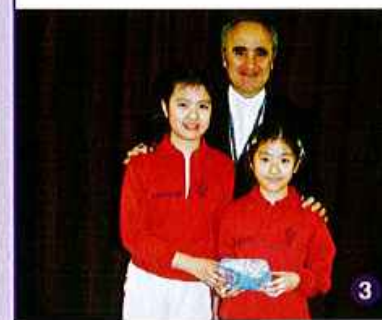

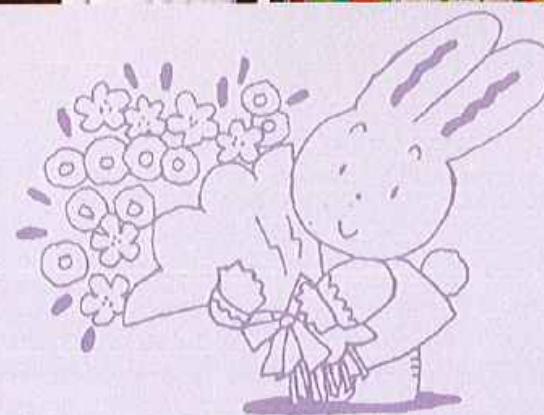
# 生命教育

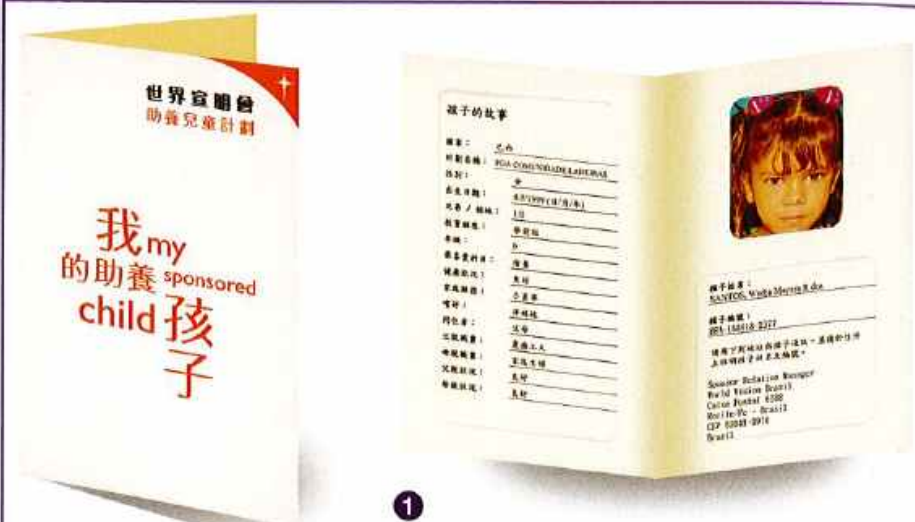


## 社會公益活動

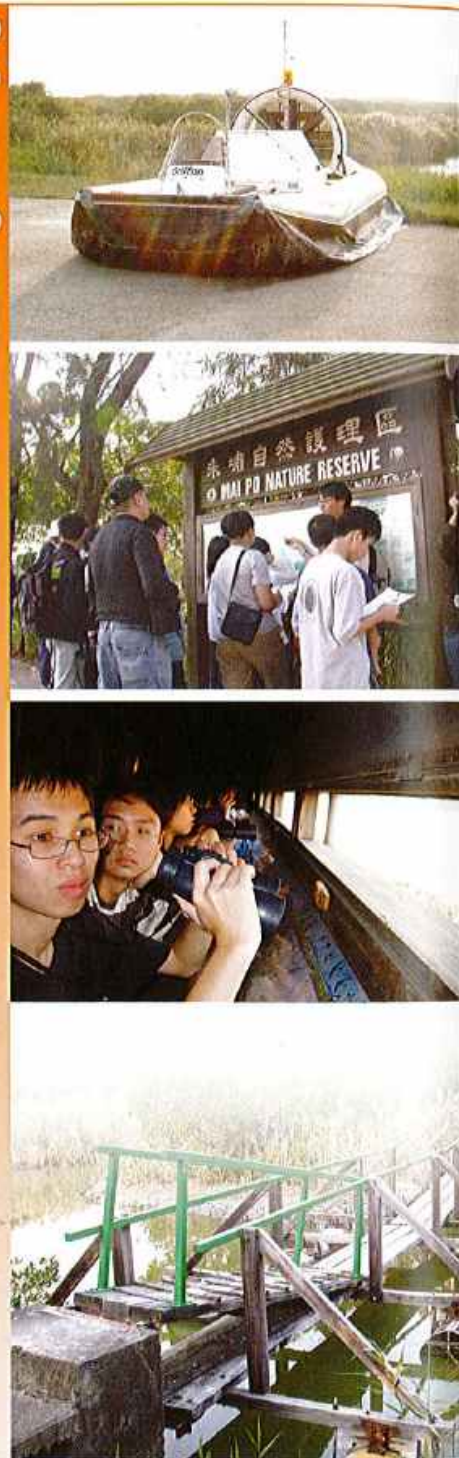
# S.4 and S.6 CAMPS

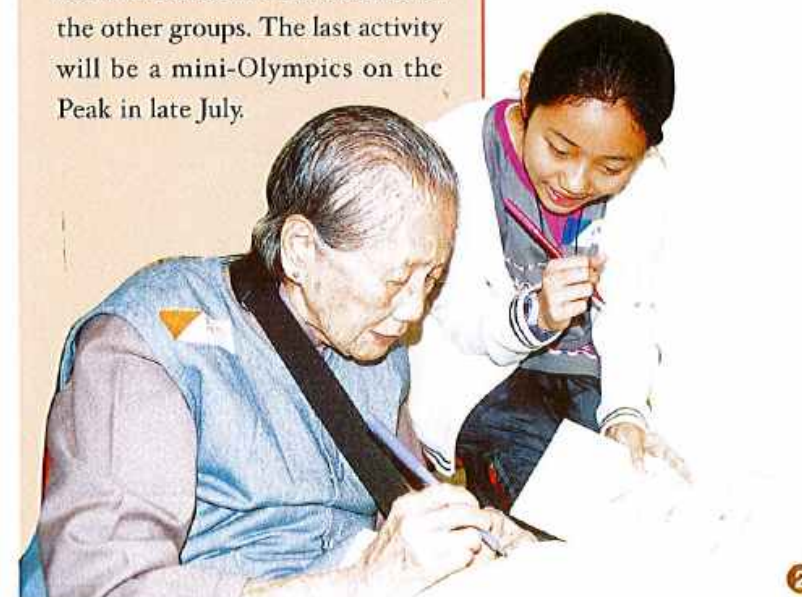

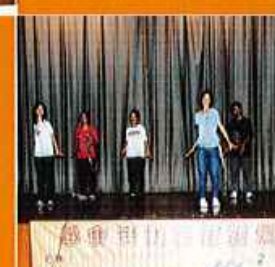

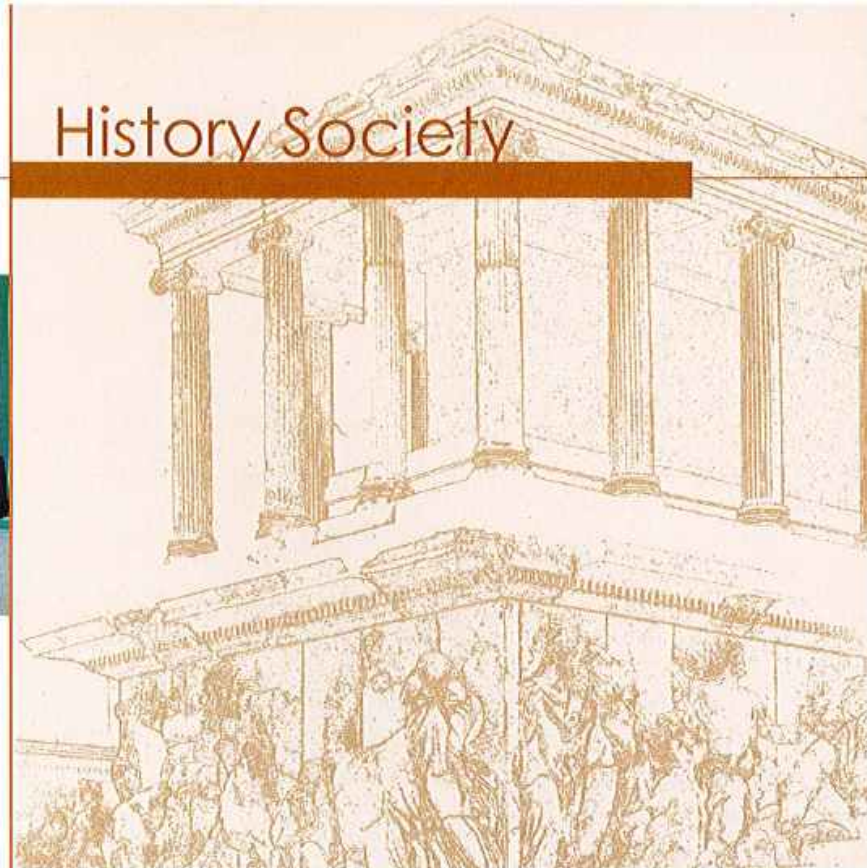


## History Society

## SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK SERVICE

The School social worker nowadays shoulders the role of a counselor, a trainer, a consultant, an advocate as well as a community resources coordinator. The services of the school social worker include casework, group work, class education, guidance and counseling on further studies and career, and empowerment programmes. A lot of emphasis had been put on advocacy through different voluntary service programs last year. For the casework service, it is found that there is an upward trend on help seeking from parents. In response to the increasing complexities of family issues and the demand for greater resiliency by individual family members, a lot of community resources will be coordinated to meet the needs of the parents.

One of our missions is to promote a caring and non-violent environment for the optimal growth of the students. I realize that prevention is always better than cure and therefore place more emphasis on prevention of bullying in a whole school approach. It is hoped that I, together with International Social Service (Hong Kong Branch), will associate with various projects and counseling services to students in the coming years.

Everyone enjoyed the open air. It was certainly a wonderful change from being in a classroom.



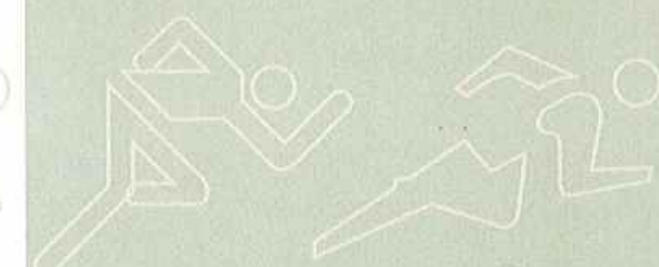

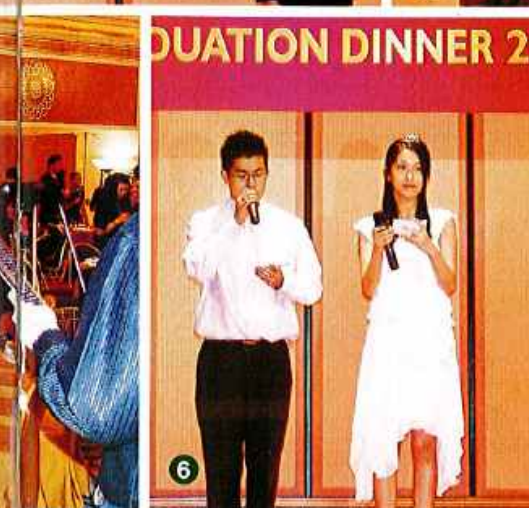
