

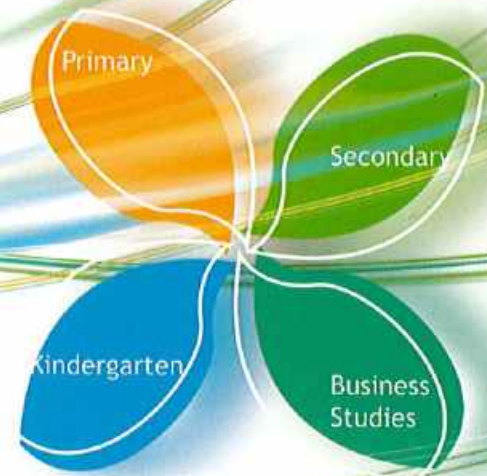

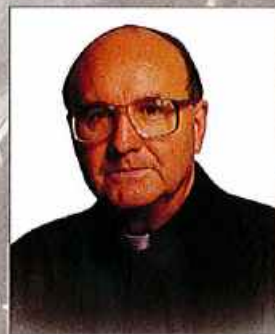

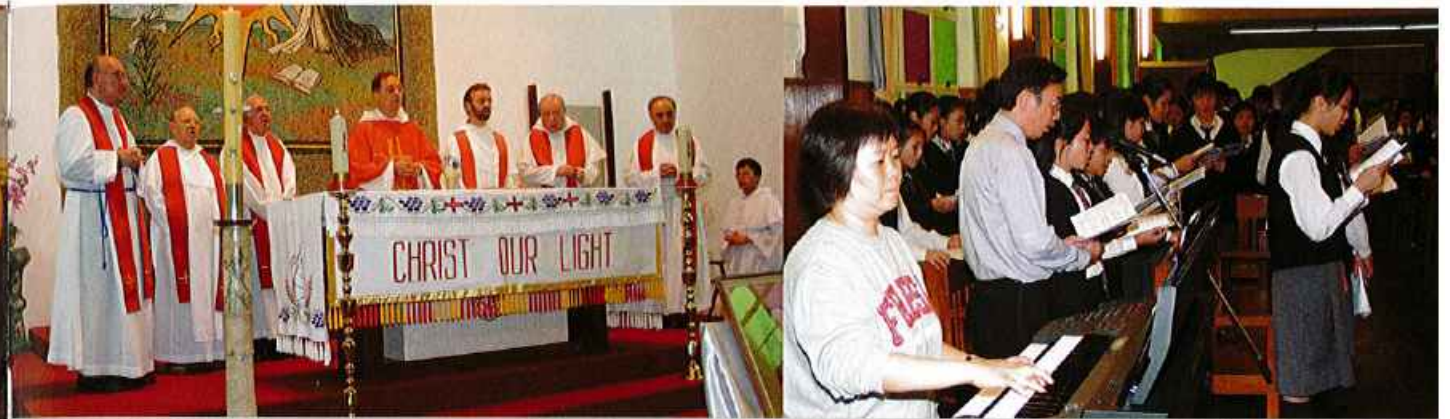

The Religious Activities that the Religious Department has set up in this year are the actual way to plant this seed: they include religious ceremonies, like the Holy Mass at the beginning of the Academic Year and throughout the year for the different Sections, regular meetings with the Catholic Students, the Recollection Day for the Teachers and Staff and also the celebration of the main festivals, like Christmas and Easter. In the Religious Week all the different sections of the School admirably worked together to create a special atmosphere in which the students, from the Kindergarten to the senior students, could have a meaningful encounter with our Catholic Religion.





RECOLLECTION DAY

It was once again time for our Staff Recollection Day when we were called to attend to the presence of God in our soul.

The teachers and staff gathered in the School Hall on the morning of 23 March 2005 to listen and reflect on what our Guest Speaker, Fr. Peter Choy (President of Holy Spirit Seminary College) had to say. After the initial spiritual readings and inspirational background music to set the tone for the rest of the event, Fr. Choy was introduced and the talk proceeded quietly. The main theme centred on how we could understand the suffering of the world by meditating on the suffering of Christ. The speaker, following in the footsteps of our Lord, used simple examples taken from everyday life to convey his thoughts to us. He didn't try to entertain us with endless jokes, although he did crack a few to bring out his points. In other words, his talk was solid, inspiring and positively good for our soul. Then, there was a brief screening of the 9/11 disaster in New York and the accounts of those who were there. This helped to heighten the sense of suffering of mankind and therefore the need to understand the suffering of Christ.

The talk ended with questions and answers and everybody left that Staff Recollection Day with much food for thought.



CHRISTMAS PARTY

This year our Faculty Christmas Party was held on 17 December 2004. The almost universal celebration of Christmas is a heart-warming occasion for all people of goodwill to get together and share in its joyful spirit.

the Birth of Jesus. Right after the Mass, awards were presented by Fr. Supervisor to teachers and staff with special long service to the School. The programme then moved to the School Hall where participants had fun with games and got to know one another better. It was one of those rare occasions when members of the school had opportunities to mix socially. The buffet dinner which followed was prepared by the school canteen and it outdid itself with food galore. Finally, the whole celebration was topped off with lots of lucky draws.

CARITAS BAZAAR

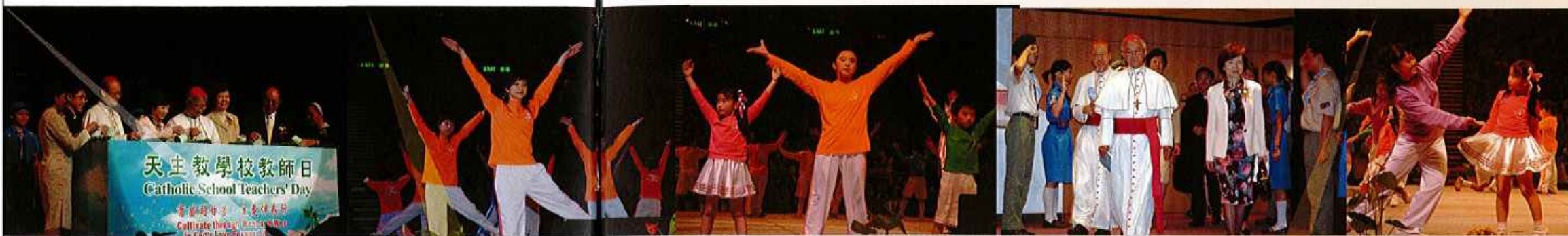

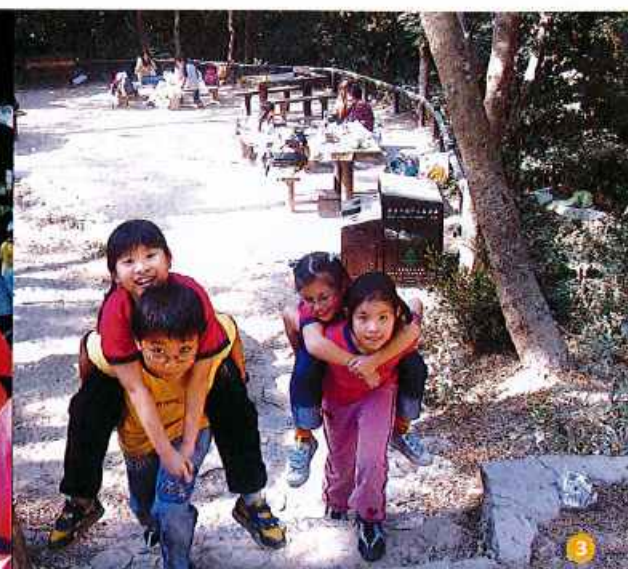


OUR WONDERFUL PICNICS

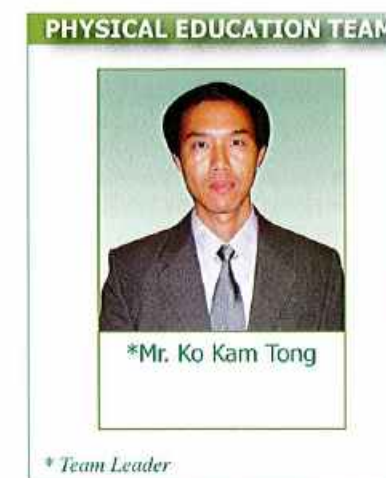
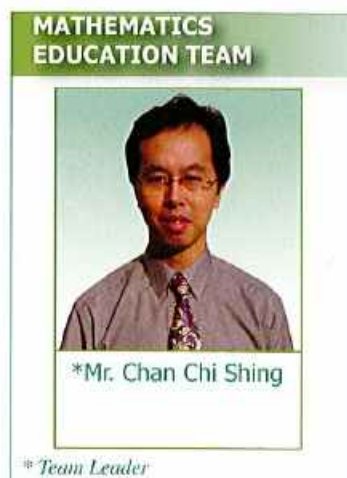
ADVISORY COMMITTEE

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

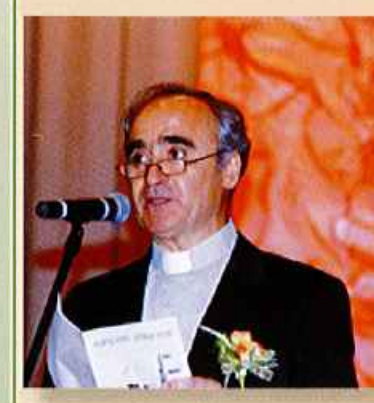
Father Principal welcomed all to the ceremony and introduced the Guest of Honour, Professor Cheng Kai Ming. He then made a short report of the school events.

Father said that the awards presented at the ceremony were the result of the good work of all our school, both students and staff. He congratulated the awarded students and the teachers receiving long service awards.

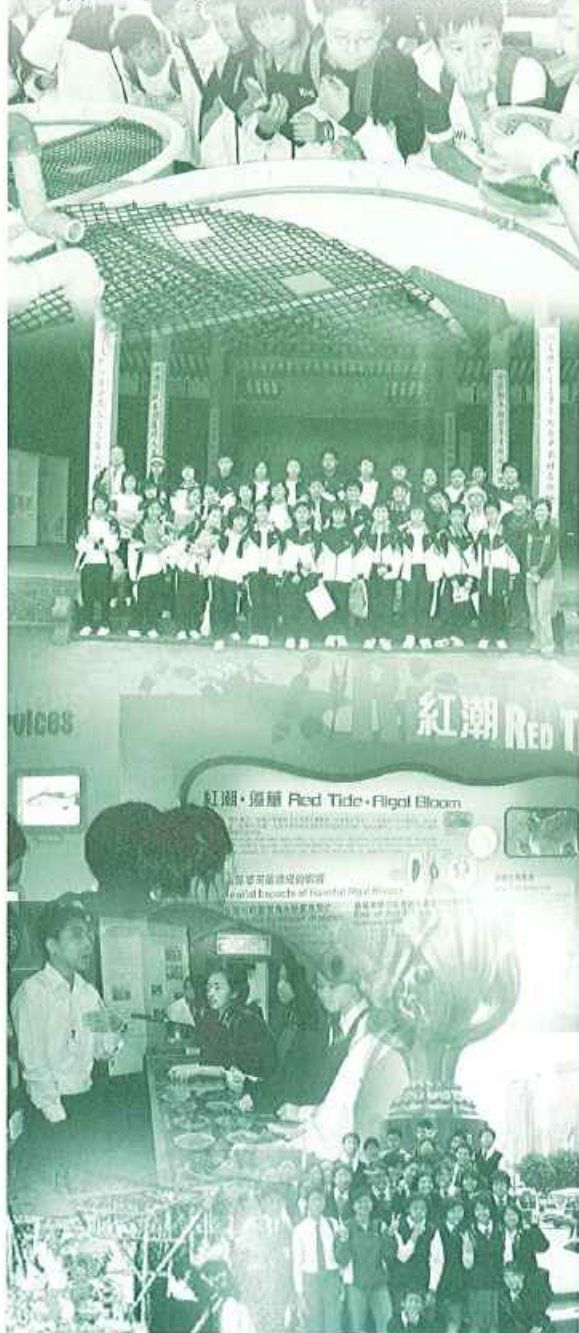
Father ended with a sincere vote of thanks to the Guest of Honour, other guests, parents, students and friends.

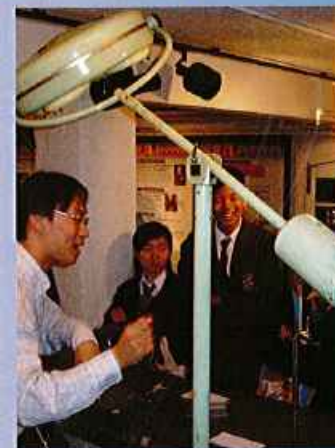

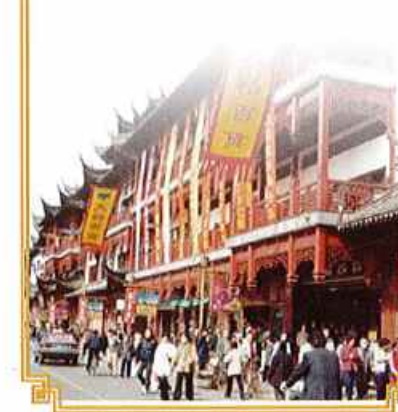

THE LIAISON OFFICE

The Liaison Office, a newly established body in the school, aims at setting up a linkage system, conveying the direction of the school and our educational ideology through publicity, organizing various activities and promoting the school image in the community. The Office consists of four teams; the Public Relations Team, the Publication Team, the School Promotion Team and the Ceremonial Team.

In the past year, the Public Relations Team organized fund raising by selling raffle tickets and setting up a Game Stall in the Caritas Bazaar. The grand dancing performance in the Catholic Schools Teachers Day was also organized by the Team.

The Publication Team takes charge of various school publications. The school homepage maintained by this team contains news and important notices to the public.

The School Promotion Team experienced a very busy December receiving students and teachers from Singaporean and Japanese schools and leading 53 students from our school to perform in the Closing Ceremony of the Arts and Sports Festival of Jiujiang School in Guangdong Province. Two schools from China and Macau were also invited to join the RHS Tournament



in April. These valuable experiences encouraged the planning of our future exchange programmes.

The Ceremonial Team takes charge of the School Opening and Closing Ceremony, Prize Giving Day and the Graduation Day. These events enhance the sense of belonging of teachers, students and parents towards RHS.

Openness and accessible attitude are important elements to make liaison work run smoothly. Members of the Liaison Office will surely work hard on this direction.



LEARNING ENGLISH THROUGH ACTIVITIES

Throughout the school year, a variety of activities that enhance the English learning environment and increase our students' exposure to the language have taken place at the school campus. Highlights of these activities include the Talking Booth, English Zone and Inter-class Competitions.

The Talking Booth, held in both the Junior and the Senior Section, involves students of the whole school engaging in group discussions led by hosts from senior classes. This activity provides extra opportunities for students to practise their speaking in a casual and friendly manner outside their classrooms. It also creates another chance for students to make more friends with their peers from other classes.

The English Zone is a new addition this year. A portion of the wall outside the classroom is decorated with interesting and creative English displays of jokes, comics, information on specific themes and any and everything that may strike the students' fancy. The displays are changed every month and the classes chosen to be the best of the level are duly awarded.



Inter-class competitions, for all form levels, are held throughout the year. All the classes flex their muscles and give their best performance in drama skits, choral speaking, singing, prose speaking, song transcription, debate and presentation competitions. It is a clear sign of team spirit!

The success of all the English activities could not have been achieved without the support of our teachers. The hard work and dedication of the teachers helped to expose the students to language situations and genres that they seldom experience in class. They can be assured that more experiences of using the target language will be coming their way in the new academic year.

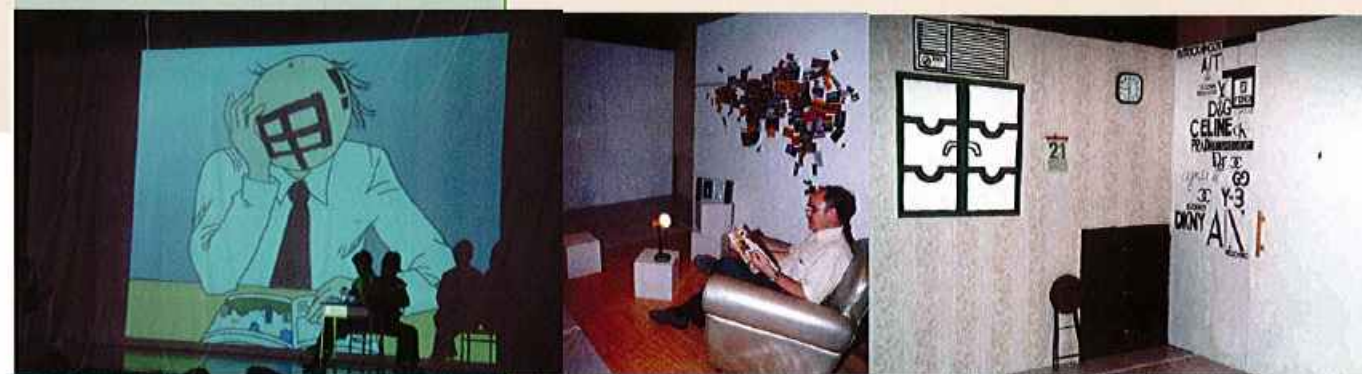


Come Come Comics

By joining the programme this year, a group of S.6 Economics students were provided with an authentic business experience through the start-up, operations, and liquidation of their own business. Under the guidance of volunteer business advisers, students formed their own board of directors, management team and work force. They set company goals, decided on a product to sell, and wrote a business plan. They capitalize, operate and finally, liquidate their JA Company.



WONDERFUL ORIENTEERING EXPERIENCE AT ROSARYHILL

Orienteering in the school compound is fun. The aim of S.1 Orienteering was to let our students know more about Rosaryhill School. In May, an exciting and competitive orienteering course was organized for S.1 students. Each class of S.1 sent two groups of students to join this activity. We set twenty checkpoints in our school. 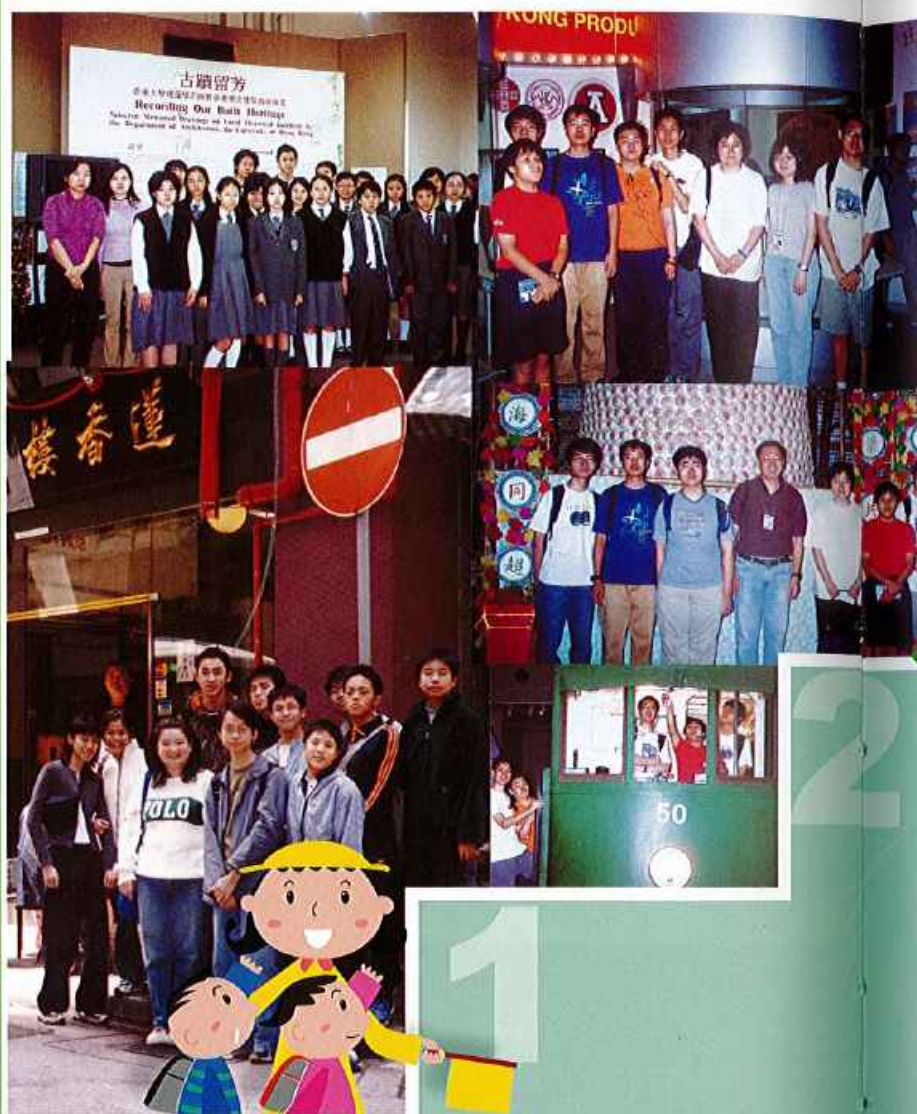
「融合教育」的分享

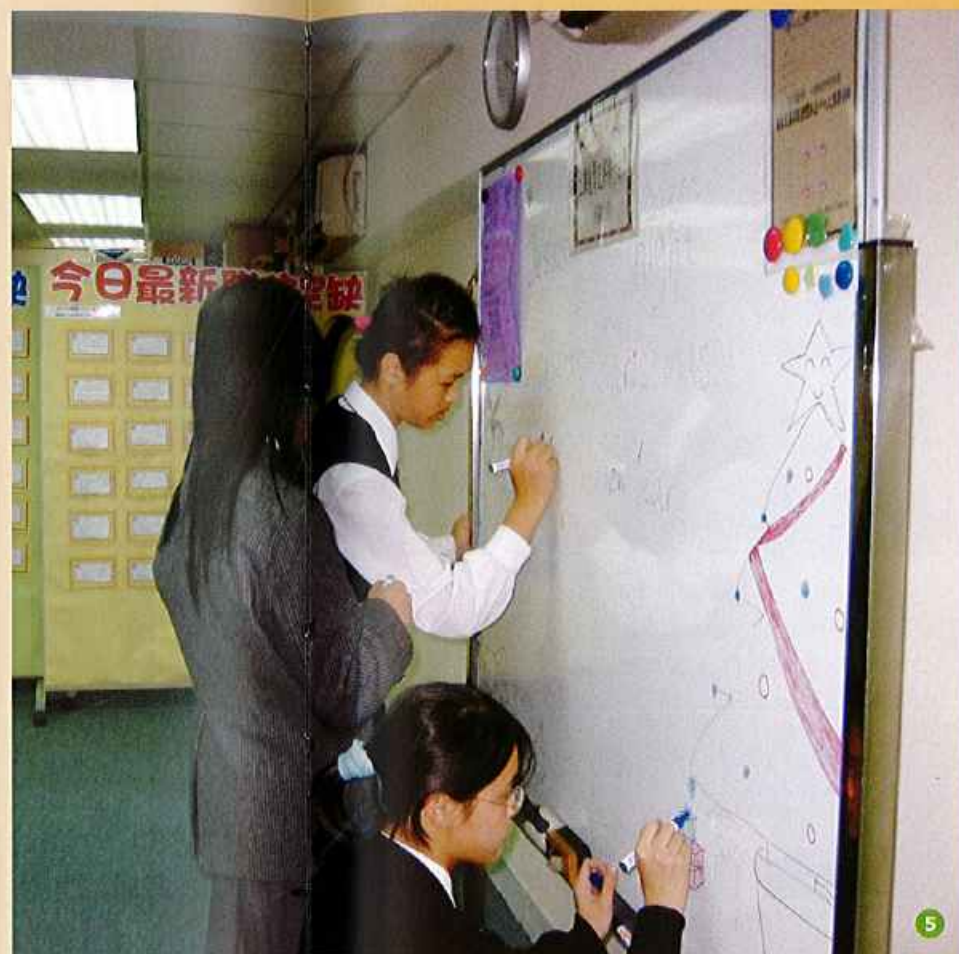


VOLUNTARY SERVICES

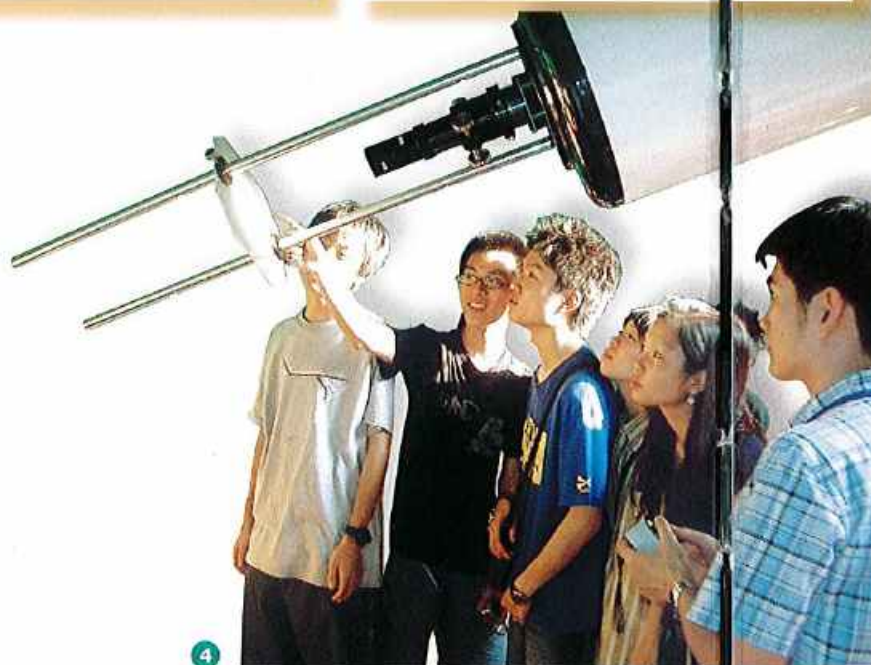


EXCHANGE TOUR IN GUANGZHOU BUSINESS STUDIES AND SOCIAL SERVICE PROGRAMME 2004

In order to help students develop their global perspectives and to provide them an in-depth understanding of the complexities and demands of the China's business environment, an "Exchange Tour in Guangzhou – Business Studies and Social Service Programme 2004" was organized with School Social Work Service of International Social Service (Hong Kong Branch) and 136 students of RHS(BSS) visited Guangzhou during 29-31 October, 2004.

With the kind assistance and arrangement of 廣州青年培訓學院, the group visited various organizations such as University's city (大學城), business enterprises (廣州本田電單車廠及羊城晚報印務中心), secondary high schools, and volunteer services organizations in Guangzhou.

Apart from exchanged ideas with local high school students on various themes in culture, history and life-styles through discussions and school visits, students were required to collect data from different business enterprises, deliver presentations, conduct marketing interviews and surveys, visit the social service organizations and provide social services for the needy.



The Students Ambassadors achieved much from the visits which broadens their horizon and enriches their experience, thus providing them with reflection and insights on social, commercial and educational development in Guangzhou. Both feedbacks from school staff and students are encouraging and most of the participants commented that they had a very rewarding experience through the programme.

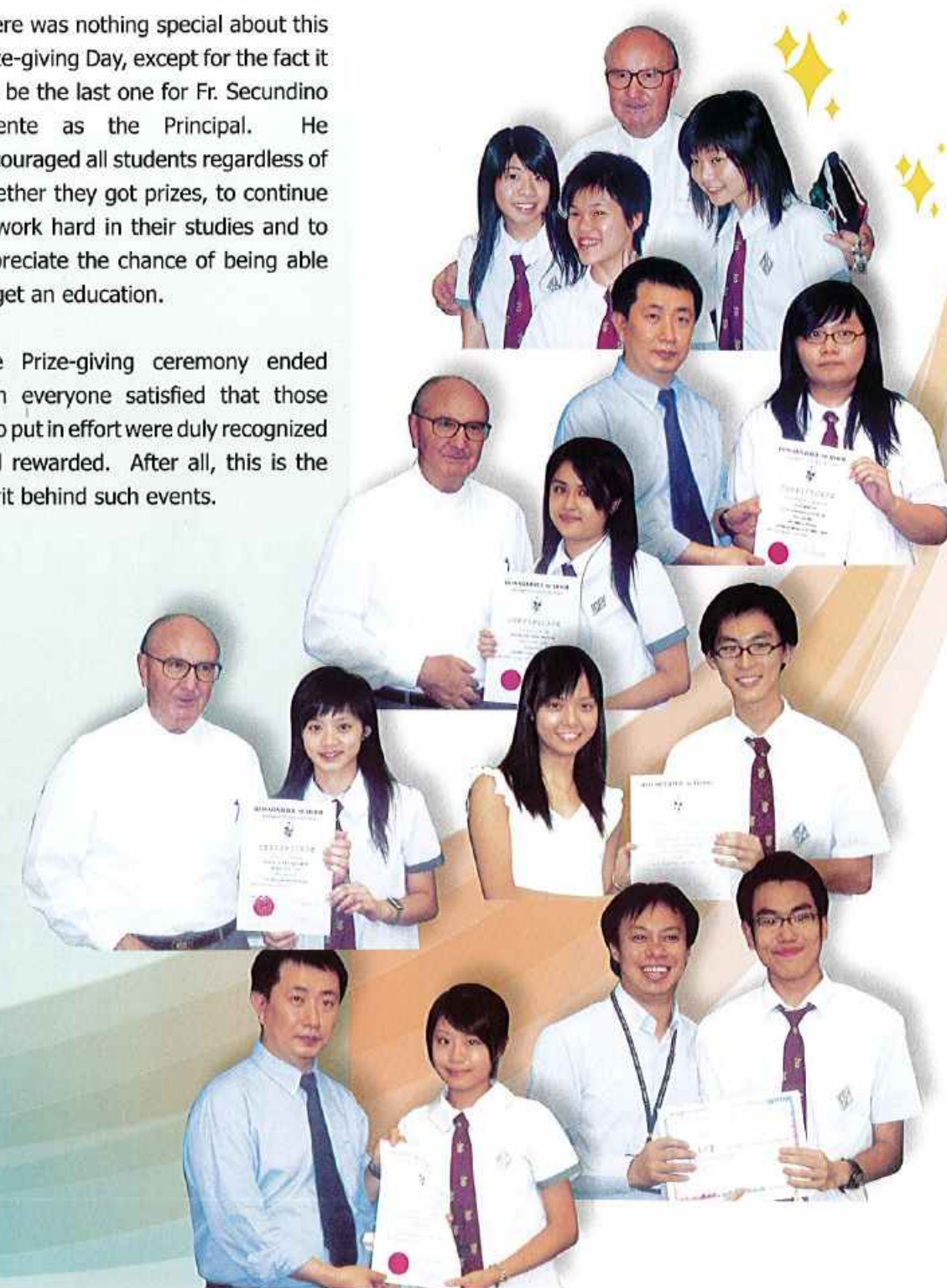
PRIZE-GIVING DAY 2005

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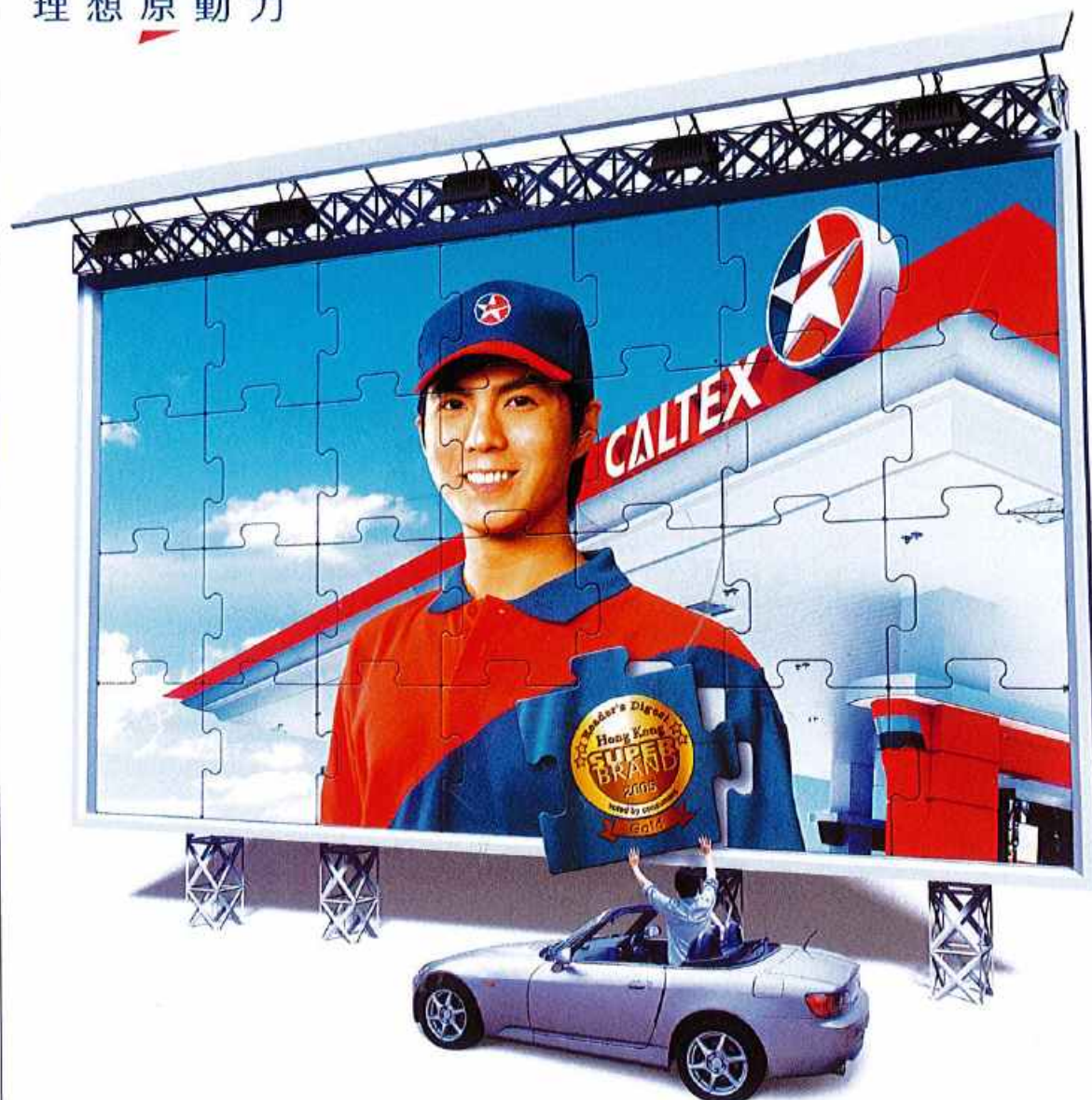
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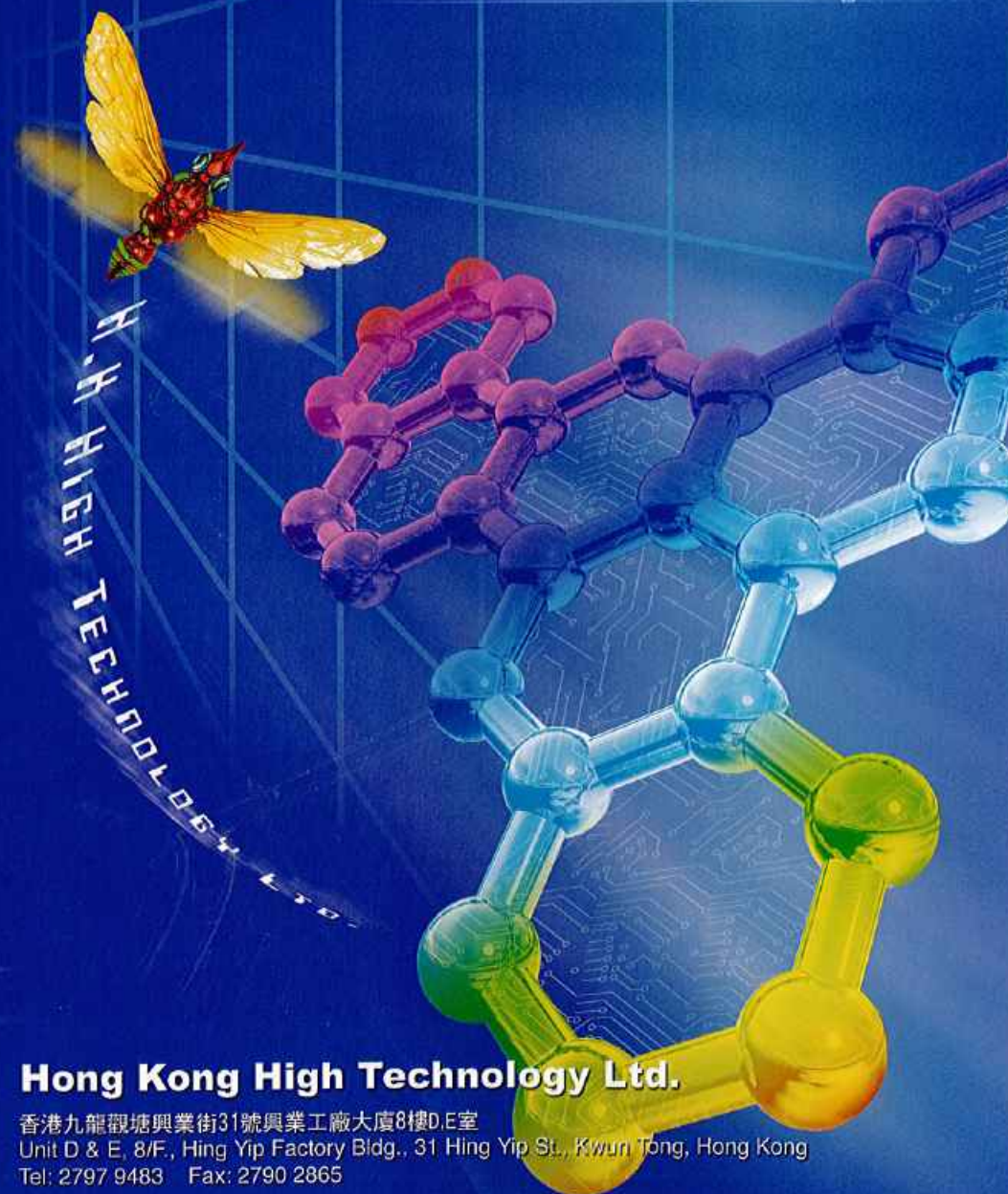
