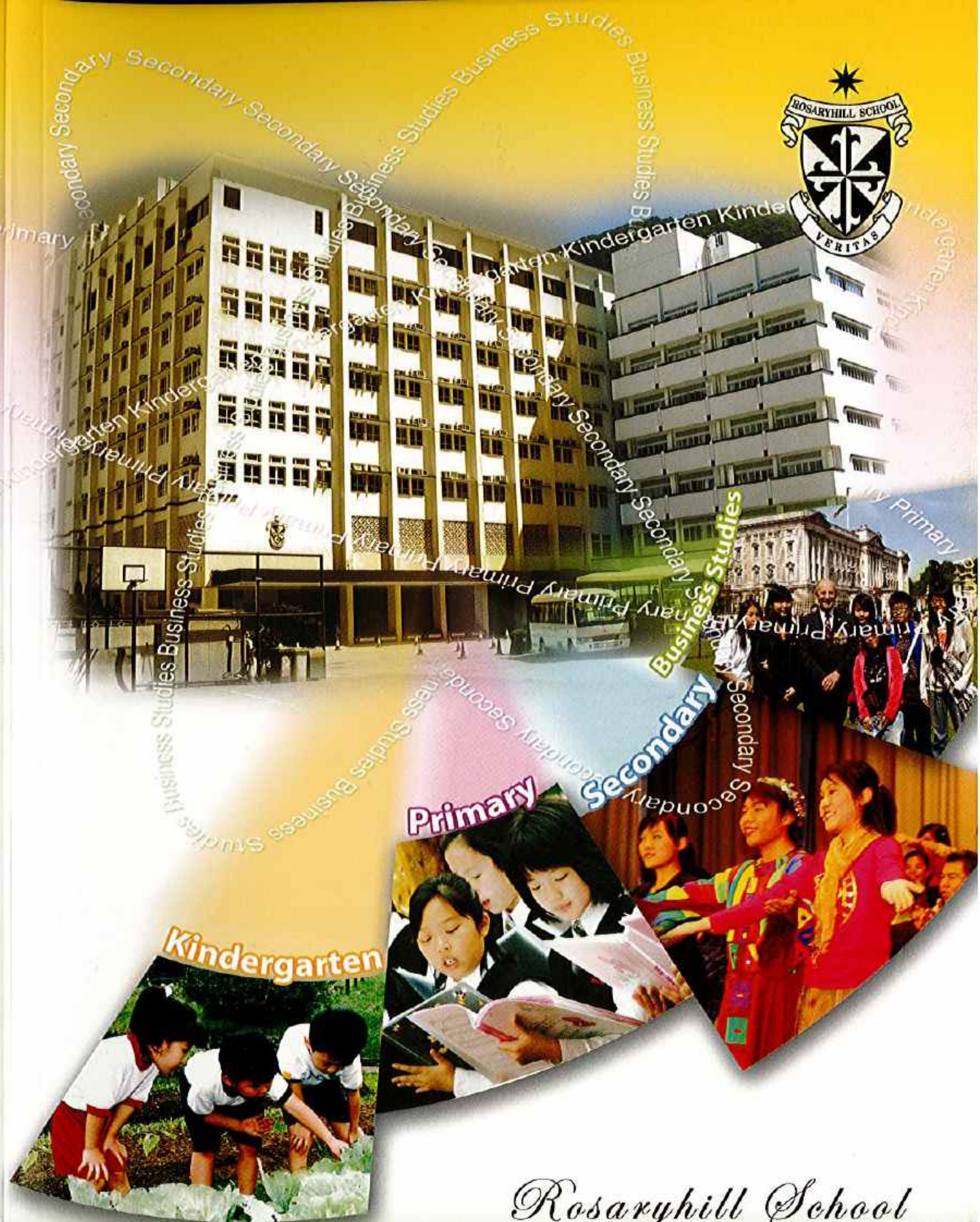

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MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR

With the publication of the first School Annual 40 years ago, Rosaryhill School reached a "milestone in the road of its existence", in the words of Fr. Lionel Xavier, Principal at that time. The publication of the 40th issue is another step in a long journey that has brought us to a school structure quite different from what it was at the time of the first School Annual.

That first School Annual presented the first major structural change of Rosaryhill School - from the old monastery where the school had been located for several years, to a new and comprehensive building, "admirably suited to its purpose", as the Director of Education said on the occasion of the official opening. 40 years later, Rosaryhill School presents a new image with the redevelopment of a part of the school from a 3 storied building to a 7 storied one. The opening of the New Annex has given us a good chance to reacquaint ourselves with an important human reality of our school, the past students.

After the construction of the New Annex, we approached past students to help raise the funds needed to better equip the building and to upgrade our school hall. It has been a pleasant surprise to receive such wonderful support from students we have not seen or heard of for so many years. It was encouraging to hear the fond memories that so many past students harbour about the school. This has made us realize that the spirit of Rosaryhill School is not just confined to the halls and classrooms of the building. Rather, this spirit exists all around Hong Kong and in many places of the world, in the hearts and minds of thousands of "Rosarians" who received their entire basic education or part of it in the portals of our school.

Even though this School Annual is not meant to be a commemorative booklet to celebrate the 40th issue since inception, through this



message I want to pay tribute to all those teachers and students who have helped to build up our school over the past 40 years. I also wish to acknowledge all those who have contributed to the good cause of our school.

The good support received is a great help to us and a sign of trust from many people towards us. Assuredly we will not disappoint our donors, all our past students and our parents.

Trusting in the God of all goodness, the God who makes our plants grow we look forward to a successful future for our school.

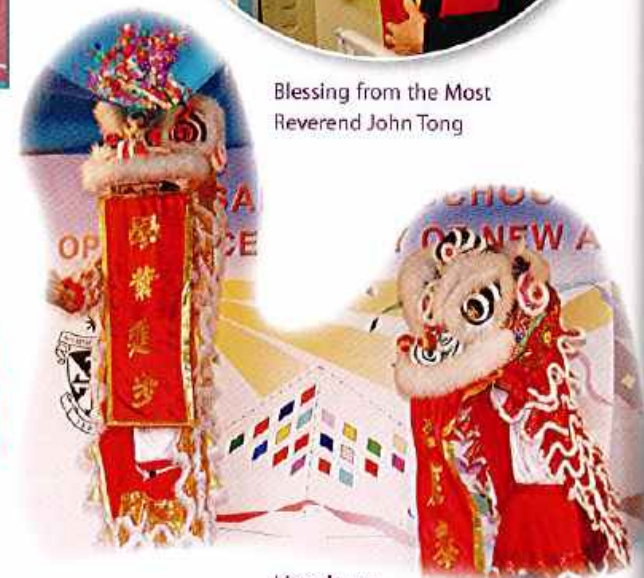

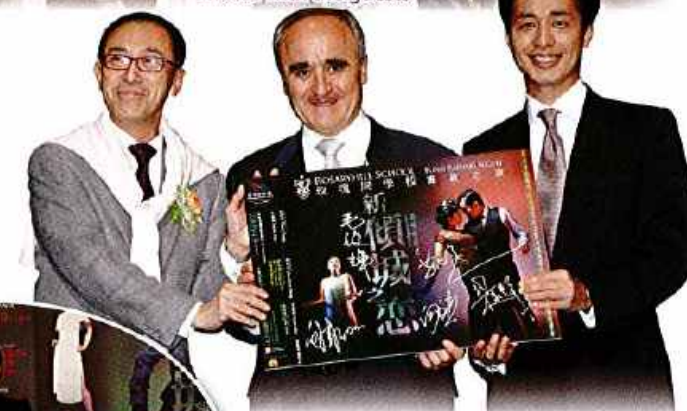
An excellent night of coherence, the Drama Night

Closing Ceremony & Variety Show 15 July 2006

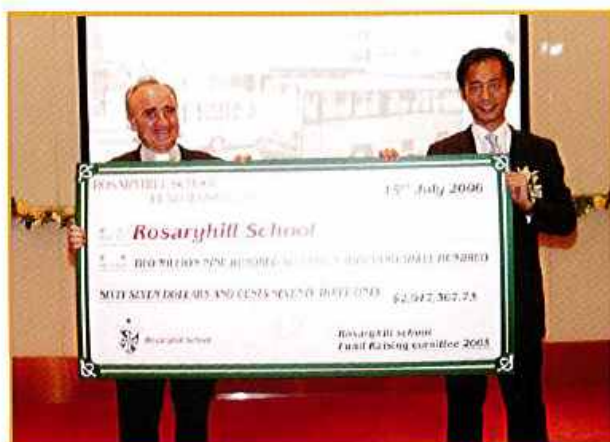

The English Performance Day on every Friday also provided students an opportunity to perform and use English in a real life situation. Both the performers and audiences showed enthusiasm on that day.

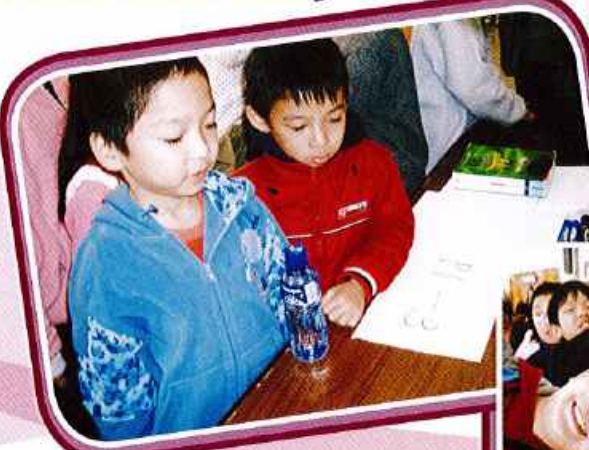

Principal's Address on Prize-Giving Day

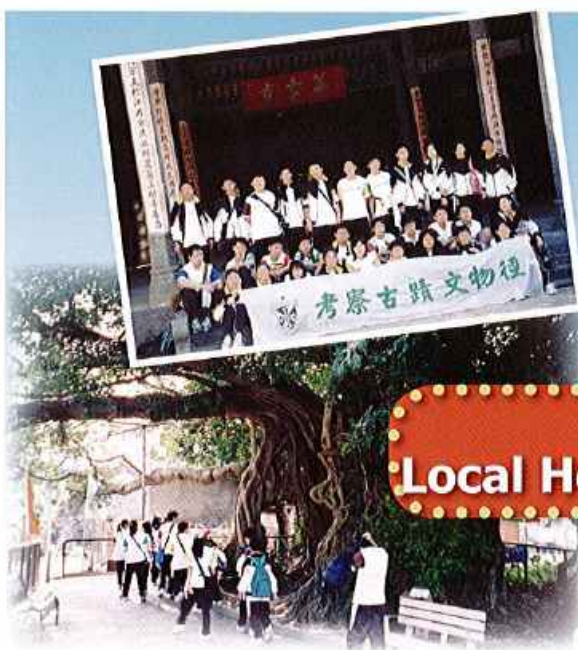

All activities were done in addition to the speaking they were doing in every single English lesson!

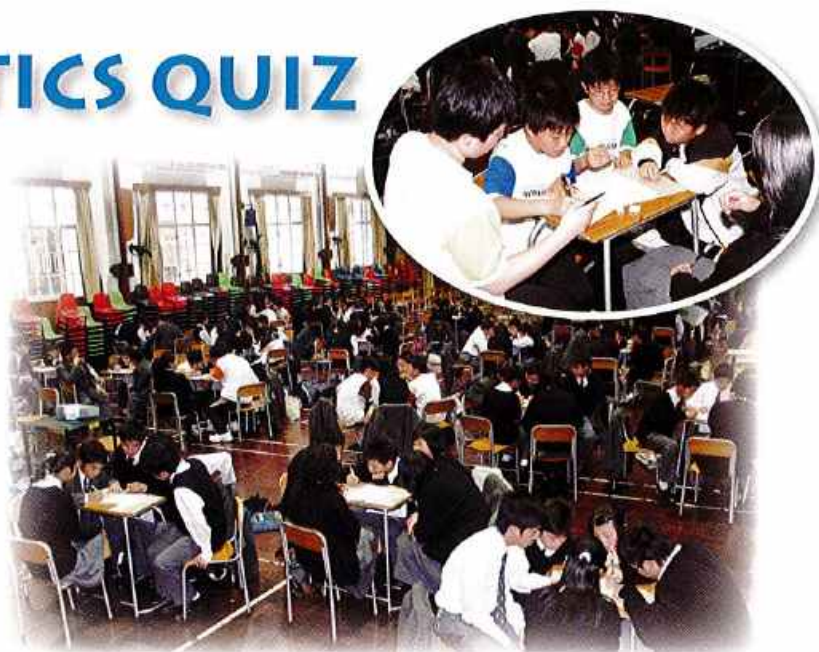

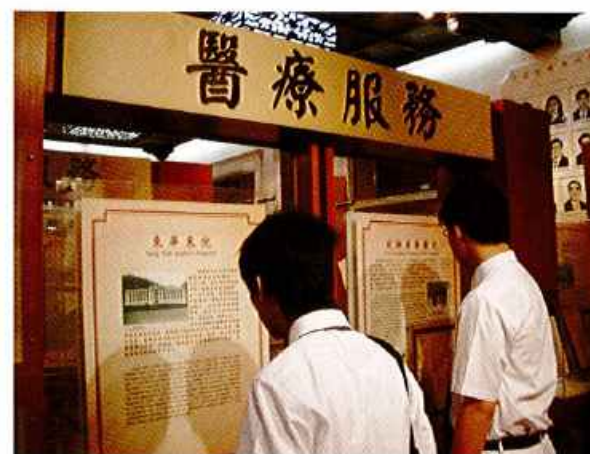


LEARNING STRATEGIES

Ten students of Rosaryhill recently participated in the Fourth Inter-school Competition of Study Projects on Hong Kong's History and Culture and won the second prize in the Junior Division. The study project provides them a valuable learning opportunity in understanding local history and cultural heritage and applying the project learning skills they have learnt - investigating, discussing, collecting and analysing data, conducting interviews and preparing reports.

Project learning is a very important part of students' learning experience. However, a successful project learning experience cannot be achieved without the scaffolding supplied by teachers. Teachers' preparatory work not only facilitates students' development of intelligence behaviours (e.g. cooperative thinking and problem-solving) and affective qualities (e.g. confidence and responsibility), but also helps students to have "I enjoy" and "I engage" feelings in project learning.

According to one teacher: "The focus of project learning should not be on what students know but on how students behave when they don't know, and on how teachers help them in undertaking the project."



YOUTH AMBASSADOR SCHEME

This year the school introduced the Youth Ambassador Scheme with the aims to enable S3-4 students to develop a healthy rapport with fellow S1 students. This helps the younger students adjust to the new school life and helps the senior students to be "mentors" enabling them to reinforce their abilities and potentials. In addition, it is hoped that they can help cultivate a harmonious school culture by being good role-models to their S1 peers.

Their duties included chatting with the students, organizing games in the classrooms during the Teacher-Student Interaction Time, helping S1 students prepare for tests during Uniform Teat periods, and accompanying students to join different school activities such as Chinese Carnival and Religious Week. 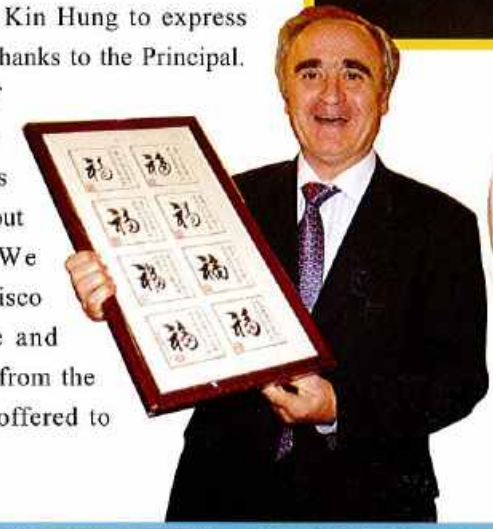

After the wonderful performance of our School Choir singing two songs to eulogize our teachers, the ceremony came to an end.



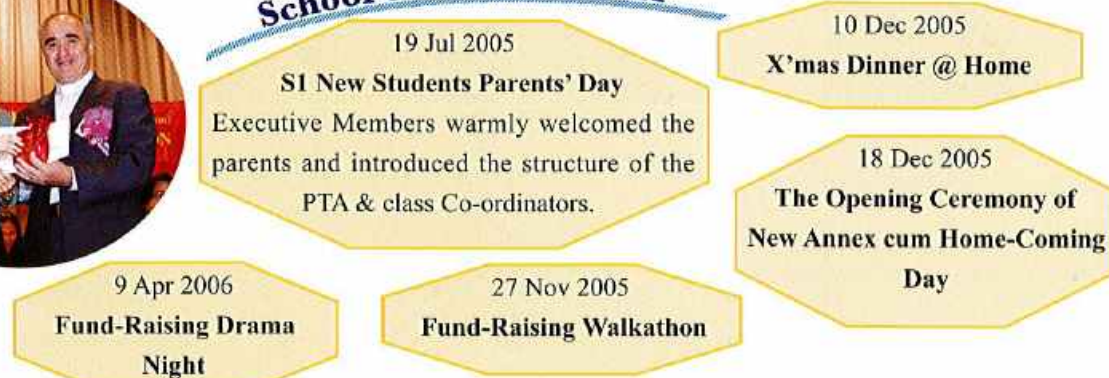

Other highlights of the event included the co-operative performances presented by different spoken-language students. They also shared their feelings and difficulties on real life.

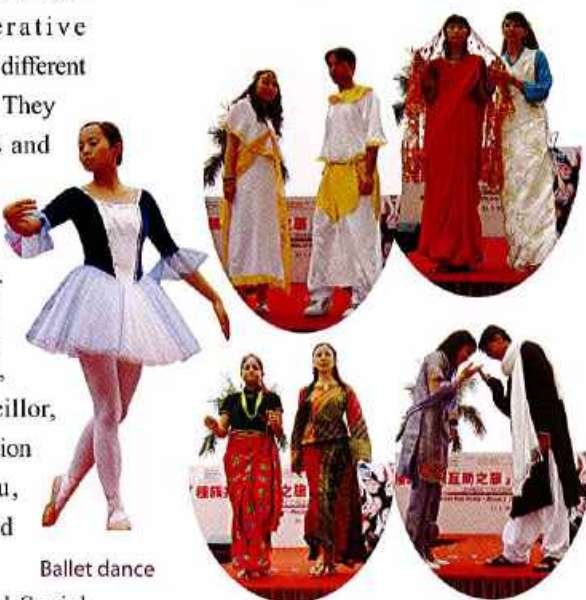

School Social Work Programme Joint School Project - '健康天地 Healthyland'

Supported financially by the Brands Education Fund and as a Hong Kong response to the Global Youth Service Day 2006 in the U.S.A., the School Social Workers of the International Social Service Hong Kong Branch were pleased to organize the Carnival, which was the climax of a series of programmes organized under the Joint School Project 05-06 '健康天地 Healthyland' on 23 April, 2006 at Fu Cheong Estate. The Project aimed at promoting healthy living style in a holistic manner. 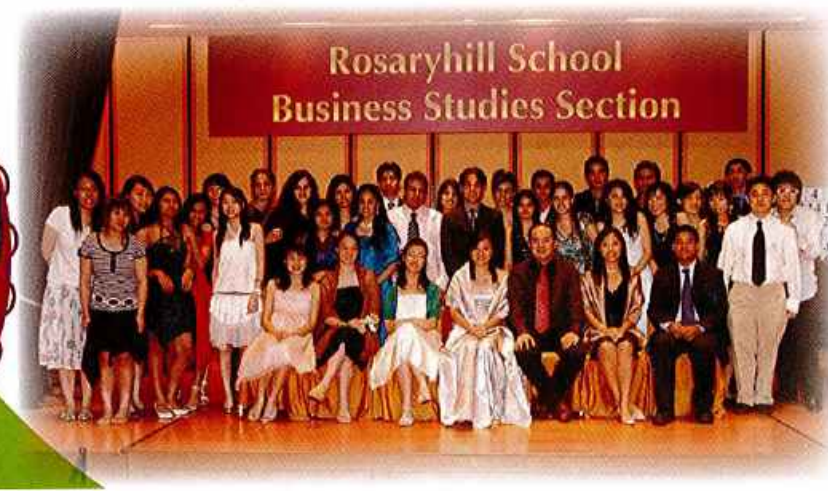
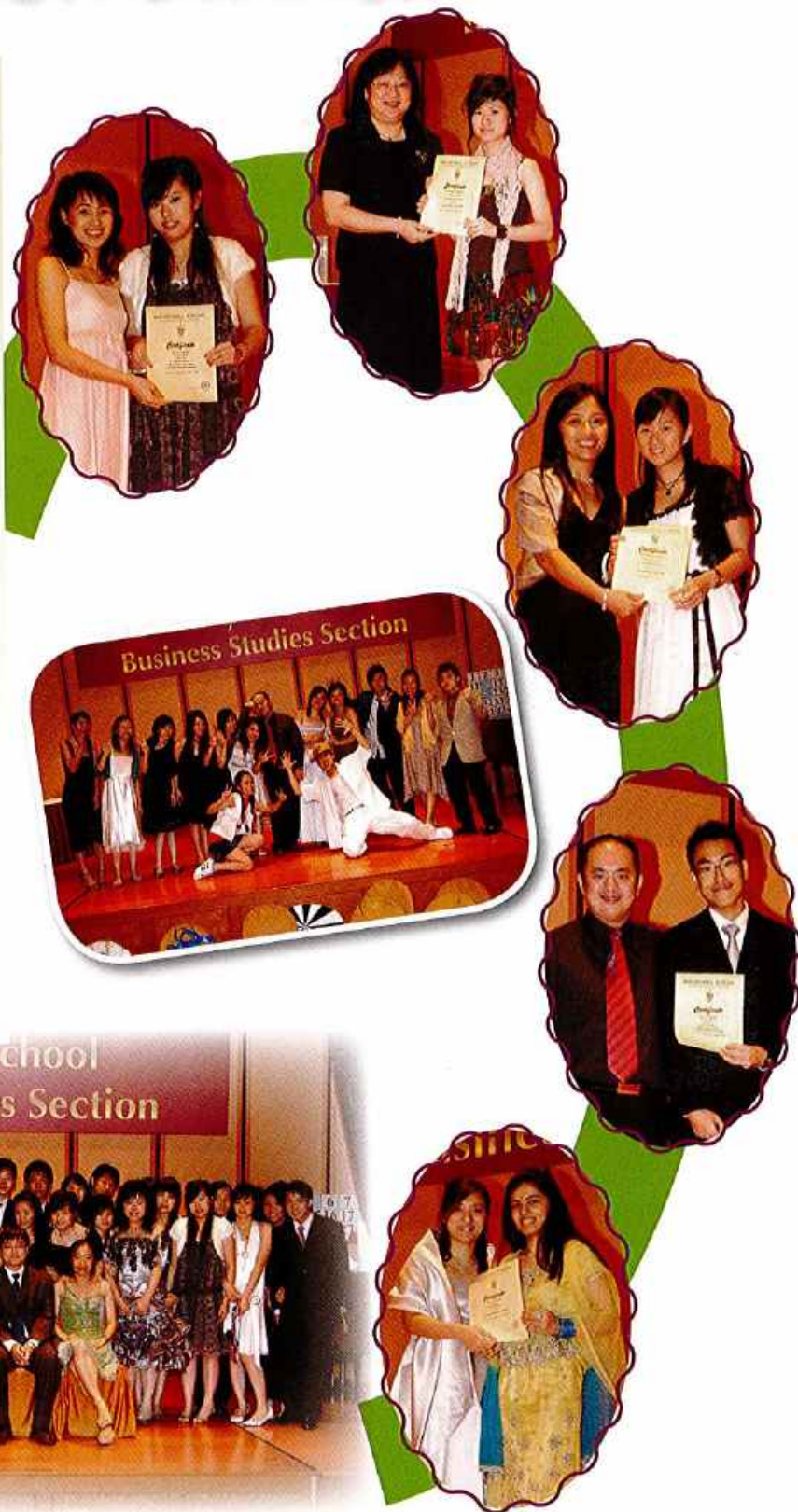


GRADUATION DINNER

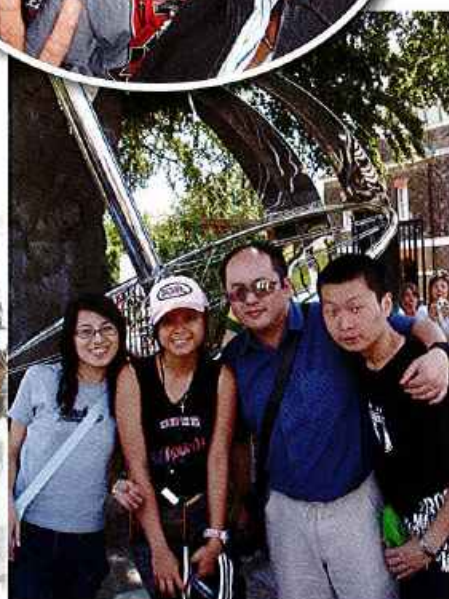
