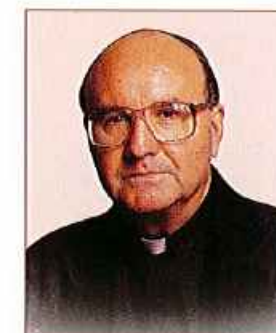

RELIGIOUS DEPARTMENT

The ultimate purpose of our Rosaryhill School is to promote the psychological, intellectual and spiritual development of our students, teachers and staff. The Religious Department tries, humbly but with enthusiasm, to reach this magnificent goal, principally in the spiritual side. We have put a lot of effort to make the religious truth closely related to the daily life of our students. We presented the messages in a more lively way with personal experiences and social issues as examples. Apart from that, we were keen on providing meditation chances for the students to foster their self-reflection as it is possible that they easily may neglect their own spiritual needs because of their busy life. Positive feedback was received from students occasionally.



The main theme of the Religious Week this year was "Dominican Missionaries: Witness of the Gospel". We have invited Fr. Jarvis a Dominican Missionary in Taiwan to address the students on the topic "Life of a Dominican Missionary". For the exhibition, projects and artworks from students were shown in the hall for the whole Religious week which attracted a lot of audiences. From the process of exploring the theme, students interviewed the Fathers in the school and looking for information about St. Dominic. We are sure that they have got a deeper understanding of St. Dominic and history of the Dominican Order.

Apart from Masses on special occasions, we have also celebrated special prayer gatherings on the Ash Wednesday and the Day of Pentecost. Religious Ceremonies were held to different forms on the topic "Light" to encourage the students to be the light of the world and hence to spread their light to others.



This year we are exceedingly grateful with two of the students who had been baptized after 2-year attendance in the Catechism Class. And on the other hand, two students won a prize in the 4th Kung Kao Po writing competition. We honestly thanks god for his benevolent providence to us this year and hope that he will be with us always, especially at our Golden Jubilee next year.

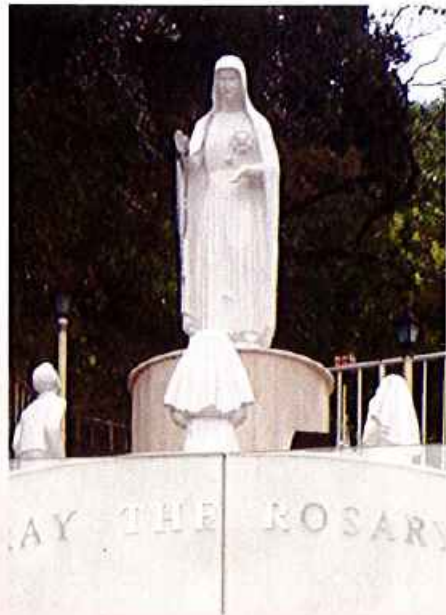

JUNIOR LEVEL

THE OCEAN PARK

In order to provide the students a chance to explore the world of living things, the Integrated Science Department arranged the Secondary One students to attend the Octopus Courses organized by the Ocean Park Academy in the Integrated Learning Week (5-9, November, 2007).

On the day of the visit, the S1 students gathered in the auditorium for a briefing session conducted by the Integrated Science teachers and then they took a coach to the Ocean Park. During the visit, the students attended a 45-minute talk on "Dolphin in Hong Kong" and they joined a guided tour. With the help of one worksheet (designed by the Education section of the Ocean Park Corporation) the students explored and discovered many animals' wonders during the visit. The students had to complete the worksheet and to gather information for writing the report, "The Animal that I Like Most".



Both the students and the teachers had a busy, exciting but enjoyable day.

On the day following the visit, the students attended a half-day workshop at school. The students were taught to search for information from various web sites and library books. The students were also helped by teacher advisers to design the layout of their report.

The students enjoyed the activities and they treasured the Learning Experience.



HONG KONG HERITAGE MUSEUM

In their visit to the New Territories Heritage Hall, our S.2 students go through a series of time tunnels that lead them through over 6,000 years of the history of the New Territories.

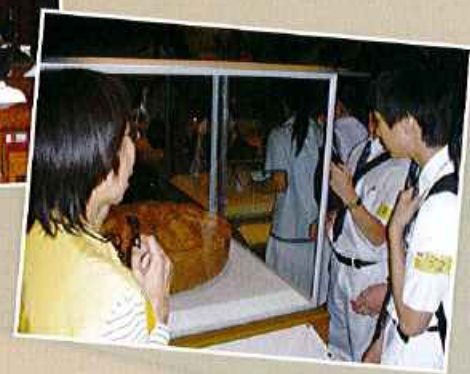
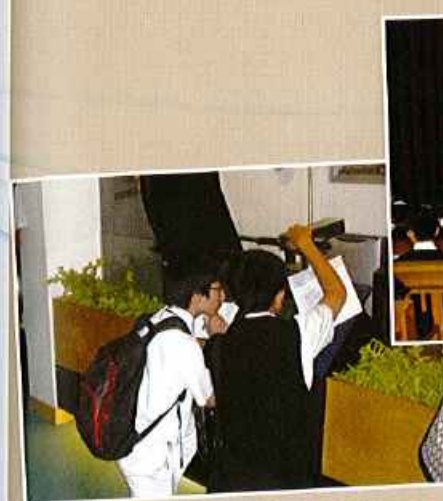
SCIENCE MUSEUM

ARTS CAMP

SMART TEENS CAMP

On November 5th, 2007 (Monday), I led a group of 49 S.4/S.6 students, with 22 boys and 27 girls participate the school's Integrated Learning Week ~ S.4 /S.6 Smart Teens Camping Activity, with two accompanying teachers: Ms. Betty Suen and Ms. Patsy Lai. The "Boys' & Girls' Club Association of Hong Kong" (BGCA) was invited to organize and run the content of the programme, which lasted for 3 days and 2 nights of adventure-based learning activities. The camping site was located at the Sai Kung Bradbury Camp, which indeed was a wonderful, natural spot with beautiful sea and refreshing countryside views. The facilities and the equipment set up were adequate and professional enough to run such Smart Teens activities.



LIFE-SKILL TRAINING

Our school and the School Social Workers of Baptist Oi Kwan Social Services organized a series of activities during the Integrated Learning Week specially for S3 & S4 students who did not take part in any camps or overseas trips. The programme aimed at developing and strengthening the students' problem solving skills, social skills as well as their team spirit. Students had a good time joining the four-day activities which comprised mainly problem solving activities, campus adventure games, and a workshop on self-image.



BEIJING TOUR

The theme of the Beijing study tour was "2008 Beijing Olympics". There were thirty-six S.4 and S.6 students and two teachers who participated in this program during 5-9 November, 2007.

During their stay in Beijing, the study group understood more about the concepts of the Beijing Olympics, in particular the People's Olympics and the Green Olympics through (1) studying Beijing's historical and cultural heritage (Forbidden City, Great Wall, Yuanmingyuan and the Temple of Heaven), (2) visiting old hutongs, and (3) their observations in Beijing. To enhance the students' sense of nationality identity, the study group also went to watch the raising of the national flag in Tiananmen Square.



Besides, the study group also got many opportunities to talk with locals. The study group had a student exchange with The High School Affiliated to Beijing Normal University. The study group made friends with the high school students and learnt more about the differences in the studying environment of the two places. What was most challenging was the students had to do informal interviews in the University of Qingwah. They found that Qingwah students were proud and dedicated to serve for the Beijing Olympics.

The study group also went to Wangfujing Street to have a glimpse of the most famous shopping street in Beijing and to the Beijing Planning Exhibition Hall to learn about Beijing's urban planning past, its present, and its future. Last but not least, the study group also had an outside sightseeing of the National Stadium (Nest) and National Swimming Centre (Water Cube). This Olympic architecture was really amazing.

After the visit, several students made use of their collected data during the Beijing tour to participate in "Understanding the Olympic Games" project competition organized by the Moral and Civic Education, EDB. The project further deepened their understanding about the Beijing Olympics.



CHINA EAST TOUR

ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

English Club Poetry Competition

In the month of May the RHS English Club hosted a poetry writing competition. Students were invited to write and submit a rhyming poem of no less than four lines. Some wonderful entries were received. The thoughtful exploration of ideas and lyrical quality of many of the poems revealed a real talent for poetry writing amongst RHS students. Prize winners in the senior section were, 1st Vicky Lam (4F), 2nd Chung Wing Nam (4F), and 3rd Newton Siu (4F). Ng Hoi Kei (3F) took 1st prize in the junior section, Stephanie Wong (3F) 2nd, and Cherrie Fong (1A) 3rd. It's hoped that even more literary talents will be discovered in next year's competition.

English Debate Team

The English Debate team was formed this academic year, and it is made up of 9 students from F.6. Being new to debating, the members needed some training before the first inter-school debate, so some internal debates were organised. The team entered the Sing Tao Inter-School debating contest and had their first debate in December. Unfortunately, we were drawn against a very strong team and lost the match, but valuable experience was gained as our team members could really understand the mechanisms and procedures of a debate as well as the strategies to adopt for a winning performance.

Two more debates were held in the second term. One, during religious week, against the Business Section of Rosaryhill school, and another against a team from Raimondi College. During the course of these two events, our team showed great improvement especially in their ability to co-operate to gather information and discuss the stance; their presentations skills were greatly enhanced too.

Debating is an activity which requires skills on many levels. The ability to understand the requirements of the motion, to formulate a stance, to predict the opponents' arguments, to summarise your arguments in a coherent speech and to deliver the speech in a convincing manner. Perhaps most importantly, debating also requires the ability to 'think on your feet' - to be able to create counter-arguments in the form of rebuttals while the debate is in progress. Debates are not won by individuals; team work is essential.

SCIENCE WEEK

The Science Key Learning Area had organized a Science Week from 5th to 9th May, 2008. During the week, various activities were held.

On 5th to 7th May, the junior form students had an Inter-class Spelling Competition. On Monday, senior form students had the "Physics is Fun" competition. They had to make an aircraft out of drinking straw and saw who's aircraft can fly the longest distance. On Tuesday, there was a water-powered rocket car competition for S2 students. They had to design and make their own cars and competed for the longest distance travelled. There was also a forum co-organized by the Religious Department and Science Key Learning Area. The topic of this year is "Pain". Mr. Joseph Yip from the Religious Department explained why people felt pain and how it was relieved by believing in God. Mr. Stephen Shi tried to explain the biochemical process of pain and chemistry of some common pain-killers. On Thursday and Friday, we had the "Fitness Programme" organized by the Biology Department, and also the Science Quizzes for S4 and S6 students.

Hundreds of students had participated in different programmes in the week and they did enjoy themselves very much. We hoped that via organizing the activities, we could arouse the interest of students in studying Science.



BIOLOGY FIELD TRIP

One of the assessment areas of AL Biology study required by the examination authority is experience in ecology field work. Therefore, all AL Biology students need to study one of the habitats in Hong Kong.

On 22/10/2007, all S7 Biology students went to Sai Keng, which is one of the mangrove habitats in Sai Kung, to have their field study. The weather on that day was fine and the level of tide was lowest at around 10:00 am to 12:30 noon and these conditions were suitable for field study.

On the site, students collected all the required data including abiotic factors such as temperature, light intensity, humidity, the slope profile and biotic factors such as the species and numbers of plants and animals of the mangroves field there. After the field trip, students are required to hand in a group report after processing all the data collected as an evidence of the experience.



GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

In November, 2007, our CE and AL Geography students had a one-day field study course at the wetlands around the Mai Po Marshes and Inner Deep Bay in the northwestern corner of Hong Kong, which formally designated a Wetland of International Importance under the Ramsar Convention. On the day of the field study, students study the topic on "Sustainable Development at Deep Bay" through a wide range of learning activities, which include role-playing, interactive games, hands-on experience, wildlife observation and identification, interpretation and debate. The field study was not only enjoyable but also very worthwhile as an educational experience for students on the wise use of nature and natural resources



JAHK COMPANY PROGRAMME

JAHK Company Programme enables young people to learn about entrepreneurship, leadership and teamwork by running their own companies while still in full-time education. The experience of acting as owners and executives of a company gives students the skills to deal effectively with the challenges of the real world and contribute to Hong Kong's future success.



Since 2003, every year a group of Rosaryhill School Secondary 6 Economics students are provided with an authentic business through the start-up, operations, and liquidation of their own business. Under the guidance of volunteer business advisers, students form their own board of directors, management team and work force. They set company goals, decide on a product to sell, and write a business plan. They design, produce and promote their own product. They capitalize, operate and finally, liquidate their JA Company.

This year again, a group of Secondary 6 students have set up their own company, 'Fruit Punch', and produce a series of different styles of recycle bags and key chains. They have gained a lot of business techniques in running a company. Through participation in the Company Programme, students are given the opportunity to develop important real-life skills and other professional skills. Upon completion of the programme, students will have developed a thorough understanding of entrepreneurship and decisions facing business owners today.

THE LEARNING STRATEGIES DEVELOPMENT TEAM

The Learning Strategies Development Team organized several activities this year, including the Pleasurable Learning Group, visit to the Universities, etc. The Pleasurable Learning Group recruited members from S1 and had regular meetings on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Besides innovative and interesting lessons designed by our teachers, we also had "Science is Fun" courses, "Learning with Fun" courses and Speech Training Courses, organized by outside bodies. We also visited Hong Kong University and the Chinese University of Hong Kong with our elite students in S.6 in April. Students learned about the courses provided by the universities and the Early Admission Scheme. We also helped to organize the Project Learning of S1~S3, the English Enrichment Programme, the Academic Low Achiever classes, Summer Academic Improvement Programme for S1 and S2 and the Period of Assignment and Self-Studying.



YOUTH AMBASSADOR SCHEME

Like previous years, the Counselling and Guidance Team and the social workers from Baptist Oi Kwan have organized the Youth Ambassador Scheme. We aim to provide our Ambassadors with the skills to build rapport with their peers, many of who are newly admitted students (NAs) from either Mainland China or transferred from other schools. The scheme aims help these newcomers to adjust to the new school environment. We hope the training enables S2-3 students to become their "buddies" and help to develop the Ambassadors' self-esteem and leadership qualities.



After the training, the students were provided opportunities to play some games with the newcomers. At Christmas, some of them gathered to make some souvenir cards and join a Christmas caroling function with the NAs. 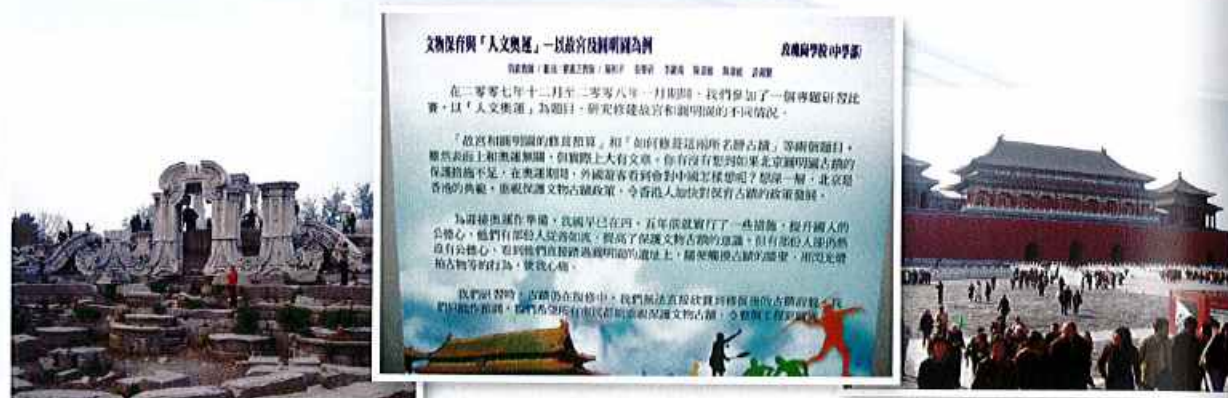

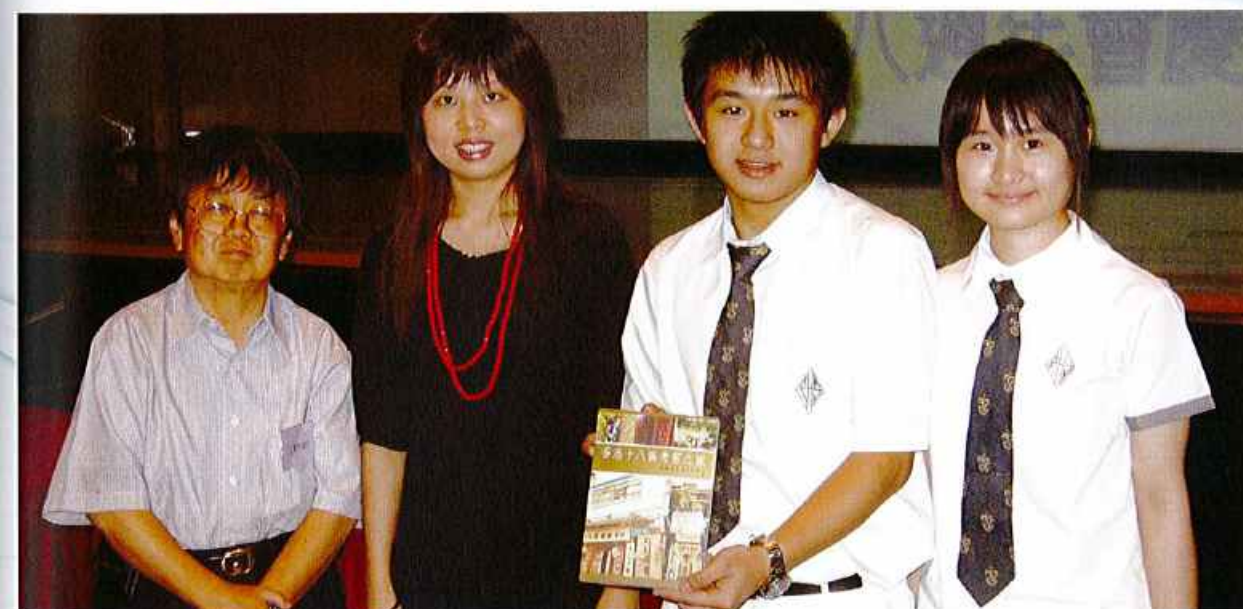


中國歷史學會

Mature adults may suggest that today's teenagers and children are over-protected; angst ridden and over-reliant that they are not mature enough to handle stress, failure and emotion. We cannot deny that the stress on youngsters is much greater than the 'days of youth' of mature adults.

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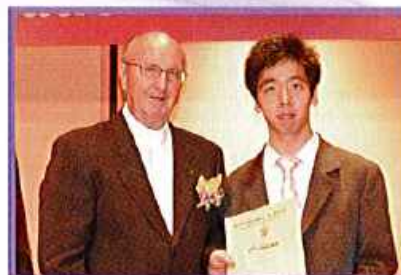
GRADUATION DINNER

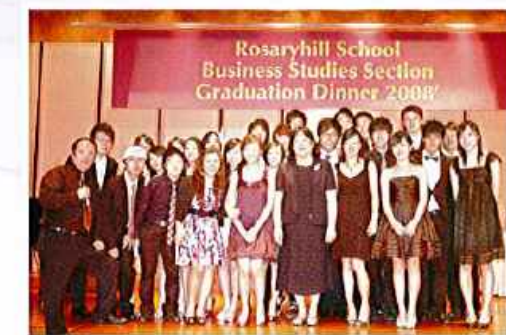

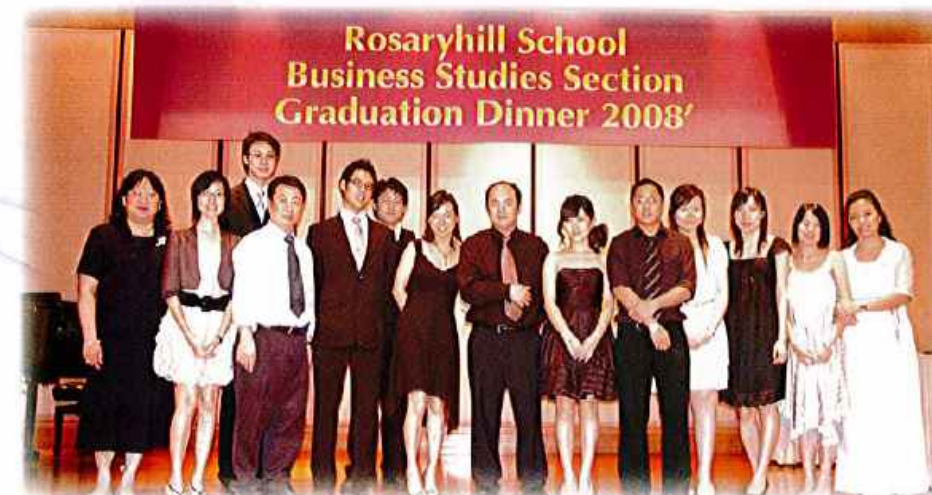

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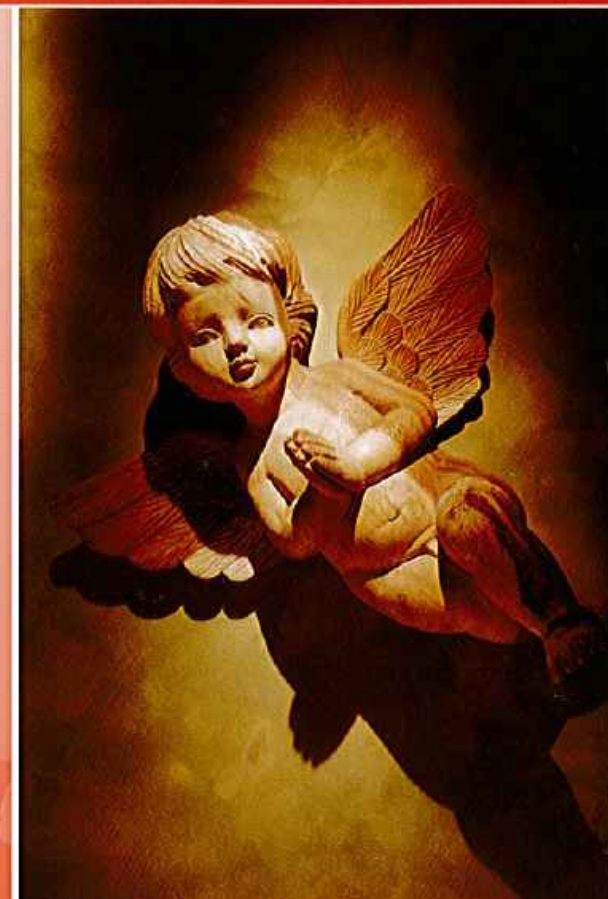
